WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Defines mobile medical clinic. Specifies that health professional be licensed by appropriate licensing board. Establishes criteria for mobile medical clinic be a non-profit and with the permission of the private property owner be located for 180 days or less.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- How mobile dental clinics are used
- Each city has a different ordinance for these types of facilities
- These units are non-profit
- Proposed amendment

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT:

Replaces original measure.

BACKGROUND:

Currently, some local governments do not have any codes or policies that allow for extended medical services to be provided by a mobile medical/dental unit that exceed a week. House Bill 3139-A allows rural Oregonians to have access to a medical/dental clinic in areas where a brick-and-mortar clinic are not sustainable because of the limited population base.
