### WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Establishes Firearms Investigation Division (FID) within Department of State Police. FID shall have no fewer than eight fulltime equivalent (FTE) Oregon State Police (OSP) troopers assigned to investigate unlawful transfers of firearms under state and federal law and assign no fewer than two FTE to engage in public education and outreach on firearms safety. Specifies components of public education and outreach.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

Senate Bill 941-MRB1 would establish the Firearms Investigation Division (FID) within Department of State Police. The FID will be responsible for increasing investigatory capabilities of Oregon State Police (OSP) and enhancing oversight and enforcement of state and federal laws related to the unlawful transfer of firearms to individuals prohibited from possessing firearms. In addition, SB 941-MRB1 would require the FID to employ at least two public education and outreach coordinators to promote firearm safety and deter unlawful transfers of firearms and distribute firearm safety kits, including firearm locking devises to the public.
