House Bill 2183

Introduced and printed pursuant to House Rule 12.00. Presession filed (at the request of House Interim Committee on Agriculture and Natural Resources)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Requires person growing Arundo donax L. for commercial purposes to file bond with Invasive Species Council. Creates exception. Allows council to make grants or loans to eradicate migrating or spreading Arundo donax L. Makes violation of bond requirement subject to civil penalty not to exceed \$25,000 for each day violation continues.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to Arundo donax L.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: 3

SECTION 1. (1) Except as provided in subsection (4) of this section, a person that engages 4 in growing the plant species Arundo donax L., commonly known as Giant Cane or Giant 5 Reed, for commercial purposes must have on file with the Invasive Species Council a valid 6 7 surety bond with one or more sureties licensed to do business in this state in the amount of: 8

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9 (a) \$1,000,000 if the total area on contiguous lots of real property that the person is using 10 or has used within the preceding 12 months for growing Arundo donax L. is 400 acres or less; 11 or

12 (b) \$25,000 per acre if the total area on contiguous lots of real property that the person 13 is using or has used within the preceding 12 months for growing Arundo donax L. is more than 400 acres. 14

(2) The council may provide grants or loans to agencies, organizations or individuals for 15 eradicating Arundo donax L. that migrates or spreads off of a property where the Arundo 16 donax is or was grown for commercial purposes. A surety bond that a person files under 17 subsection (1) of this section must be conditioned to provide payment to the council in the 18 amount of any grants or loans made under this subsection due to migration or spreading of 19 20 Arundo donax L. from the property that is discovered during the bond period. A bond described in this section must be in effect for at least a one-year period or until depleted by 21 payments to the council, unless the surety sooner cancels the bond. At the discretion of the 22 surety, that bond may be continued for an additional period by continuation certificate. The 2324 person shall maintain a bond in force until one year after the person ceases to use the 25property for growing Arundo donax L.

(3) The State Department of Agriculture may impose a civil penalty, not to exceed 26 27\$25,000, on a person that fails to comply with a bonding requirement imposed under this section. Each day that a person continues to fail to comply with the bonding requirement is 28 29 a separate violation subject to a separate civil penalty.

(4) Subsection (1) of this section does not apply to the commercial growing of a plant in 30
