HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 2198

In line 2 of the printed bill, after the semicolon delete the rest of the line and insert "creating 1 $\mathbf{2}$ new provisions; and amending ORS 456.559.". 3 Delete lines 4 through 13 and insert: "SECTION 1. As used in sections 1 to 3 of this 2015 Act: 4 $\mathbf{5}$ "(1) 'Affordable housing' means dwelling units that may be purchased or rented, with or without government assistance, by persons who meet the applicable income limits of local, 6 7 state or federally funded programs or developments. "(2) 'Area median income' means the median income for the metropolitan statistical area 8 9 in which the subject housing is located, adjusted for family size, as determined by the 10 Housing and Community Services Department using United States Department of Housing 11 and Urban Development information. 12"(3) 'Development costs' has the meaning given that term in ORS 456.548. 13 "SECTION 2. (1) The Housing and Community Services Department shall, subject to the 14 policies of the State Housing Council, develop and implement the Affordable Family Housing 15Development Program for the purpose of expanding the state's supply of affordable housing 16 for families with children that have family incomes below 60 percent of the area median in-17 come. 18 "(2) The department may implement and administer the program to: 19 "(a) Acquire, construct, develop, improve, rehabilitate and own affordable housing in this state for families with children; 20 21"(b) Pay development costs to develop affordable housing under the program, including 22but not limited to any costs that may be capitalized under generally accepted accounting principles, and the costs of consultants or advisers retained by the State Treasurer or the 2324 department; and 25"(c) Make grants to eligible applicants for the construction, development, improvement 26 or rehabilitation of affordable housing, subject to the review of the State Housing Council. 27"(3) The department may enter into agreements with qualified third parties to develop, 28manage and operate the affordable housing acquired, constructed, developed, improved, re-29 habilitated and owned by the program. The department is not subject to the provisions of ORS chapter 279A or 279B in entering into an agreement under this subsection. The depart-30 31 ment shall establish by rule procedures for inviting proposals and making agreements under 32this subsection. 33 "(4) Affordable housing that is acquired, constructed, developed, improved or rehabili-34 tated under the program may be owned, in whole or in part, by the state or the department.

35 "(5)(a) In making grants for the construction, development, improvement or rehabili-

1 tation of affordable housing under the program, the department shall give preference to ap-

2 plicants with projects that will:

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"(A) Provide the greatest number of affordable housing units for the amount of the grant
allowed; and

"(B) Ensure the longest possible use as affordable housing units.

6 "(b) For the purpose of making grants under the program, the State Housing Council 7 may adopt a formula that:

8 "(A) Optimizes the interest of the applicant and the working life of the affordable housing
9 unit; and

10 "(B) Takes into account the means to reduce the cost of the affordable housing while 11 considering factors such as the quality of construction, durability and local design require-12 ments.

"(6)(a) It shall be the policy of the State Housing Council that funds and resources that are made available through the program be distributed statewide while concentrating funds and resources in those areas of the state with the greatest need for affordable housing, as determined by the council. In implementing this policy, the department and the council shall consider the following factors on a county-by-county basis:

"(A) The proportion of renters in the county with a severe rent burden;

"(B) Underserved geographies, taking into account the proportion of households of families with children that have extremely low incomes compared to the availability of affordable
housing within the geography; and

"(C) Market data, including but not limited to the cost of housing, vacancy rates and
 available affordable housing supply.

24 "(b) As used in this subsection, 'severe rent burden' means rent that is more than 50 25 percent of the family income for a family with children.

26 "(7) For purposes of implementing the program, the State Housing Council shall develop 27 strategies to:

"(a) Reach traditionally underserved communities including communities of color and
 rural communities;

"(b) Reduce the cost of constructing, developing, improving or rehabilitating affordable
 housing;

"(c) Involve regional solutions advisory committees and teams, Early Learning Hubs,
 coordinated care organizations and others; and

34 "(d) Ensure funds distributed by the program contribute to addressing other state pri-35 orities.

36 "(8) The Director of the Housing and Community Services Department shall report reg-37 ularly to the State Housing Council regarding the status and progress of the program and 38 of the department's responsibilities for implementing and administering the program.

39 "(9) The department shall adopt rules to implement the provisions of this section, in-40 cluding but not limited to prescribing qualifications and requirements for making grants and 41 for acquiring, constructing, developing, improving, rehabilitating and owning affordable 42 housing under the program.

43 "<u>SECTION 3.</u> (1) There is created within the State Treasury, separate and distinct from
44 the General Fund, the Affordable Family Housing Development Program Fund. Interest
45 earned by the Affordable Family Housing Development Program Fund shall be credited to the

1 fund.

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2 "(2) Moneys in the fund shall consist of:

3 "(a) Amounts donated to the fund;

"(b) Amounts appropriated or otherwise transferred to the fund by the Legislative As-4 sembly; 5

"(c) Investment earnings received on moneys in the fund; and

"(d) Other amounts deposited in the fund from any source.

8 "(3) Moneys in the fund are continuously appropriated to the Housing and Community Services Department to carry out the provisions of sections 1 to 3 of this 2015 Act. 9

"(4) The department may use moneys in the fund to pay the administrative costs asso-10 ciated with the fund and with implementing and administering the provisions of section 2 of 11 12this 2015 Act.

"SECTION 4. On or before February 1, 2016, the Housing and Community Services De-13partment shall prepare and submit a report to the interim committees of the Legislative 14 Assembly that have authority over the subject area of housing regarding the Affordable 1516 Family Housing Development Program and implementation of sections 1 to 3 of this 2015 Act. 17

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"SECTION 5. ORS 456.559 is amended to read:

"456.559. (1) The Housing and Community Services Department shall:

19 "(a) Maintain current housing data and information concerning available programs, status of 20funding, programs planned or undertaken which might conflict with, overlap, duplicate or supersede 21other planned or existing programs and call these to the attention of appropriate state agencies, 22governmental bodies and public or private housing sponsors.

23"(b) Provide to appropriate state agencies, governmental bodies and public or private housing sponsors such advisory and educational services as will assist them in the development of housing 24 25plans and projects.

26"(c) Subject to the approval of the State Housing Council, make noninterest bearing advances, 27in accordance with ORS 456.710 and the policies of the department to qualified nonprofit sponsors 28 for development costs of housing projects until mortgage funds are released to repay the advances as provided in ORS 456.710. 29

30 (d) Advise and assist appropriate state agencies, governmental bodies and public or private housing sponsors, cities and counties, in all programs and activities which are designed or might 31tend to fulfill the purposes of ORS 456.548 to 456.725 and ORS chapter 458. 32

33 "(e) Encourage and assist in the planning, development, construction, rehabilitation and con-34servation of dwelling units for persons and families of lower income.

35 "(f) Be the central state department to apply for, receive and distribute, on behalf of appropriate state agencies, governmental bodies and public or private housing sponsors in the state, grants, gifts, 36 37 contributions, loans, credits or assistance from the federal government or any other source for 38 housing programs except when the donor, grantor, or lender of such funds specifically directs some other agency to administer them. Moneys received under this section shall be deposited with the 39 40 State Treasurer in an account separate and distinct from the General Fund. Interest earned by the 41 account shall be credited to the account.

42"(g) For the purposes of acquiring moneys, credits or other assistance from any agency or instrumentality of the United States or from any public corporation chartered by the United States, 43 44 comply with any applicable agreements or restrictions for the receipt of such assistance and become 45 a member of any such association or public corporation chartered by the United States.

1 "(h) Assist individuals, appropriate state agencies, governmental bodies and public or private 2 housing sponsors through a program which provides housing information, planning, educational 3 services and technical assistance.

4 "(i) Comply with the requirements of ORS 443.225 in assisting in the development of any housing
5 for residential care, training or treatment for persons with mental retardation, developmental disa6 bilities or mental or emotional disturbances.

"(2) Except as otherwise provided in ORS 456.625 (7) and sections 1 to 3 of this 2015 Act, the department may not itself develop, construct, rehabilitate or conserve housing units; and neither the department nor any housing sponsor, including but not limited to any association, corporation, cooperative housing authority or urban renewal agency organized to provide housing and other facilities pursuant to ORS 456.548 to 456.725, may own, acquire, construct, purchase, lease, operate or maintain utility facilities, including facilities for the generation of electricity, for the distribution of gas and electricity, and for the conveyance of telephone and telegraph messages.

"(3) In accordance with the provisions of this section and with the advice of the council, the 14 15department shall establish statewide priorities for housing programs. State agencies shall coordinate 16 their housing programs with the department. All state agencies intending to apply for federal funds 17for use in planning, developing or managing housing, or rendering assistance to governmental bodies 18 or sponsors or individuals involved therein shall submit a description of the proposed activity to the 19 department for review not less than 30 days prior to the intended date of submission of the appli-20cation to the federal agency. The department shall determine whether the proposal would result in 21a program that would overlap, duplicate or conflict with any other housing program in the state. If 22the department finds overlapping or duplication or conflict, it shall recommend modifications in the 23application. The Oregon Department of Administrative Services shall consider these recommen-24 dations in making its decision to approve or disapprove the application. The department shall com-25plete its review and forward its recommendations within 15 working days after receipt of the 26 notification. Failure of the department to complete the review within that time shall constitute ap-27proval of the application by the department.

"(4) The director may participate in discussions and deliberations of the council. The director may suggest policies and rules to the council, including those necessary to stimulate and increase the supply of housing for persons and families of lower income.".

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
