SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Creates office of State Resilience Officer in Oregon Department of Administrative Services to direct, coordinate and oversee seismic safety and resilience planning and preparation by state agencies.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to seismic resilience planning.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) The office of State Resilience Officer is created in the Oregon Depart-

5 ment of Administrative Services for the purpose of directing, coordinating and overseeing

6 policy related to state agency planning and preparation for seismic safety and resilience.

7 (2) The Governor shall appoint an individual to serve as the State Resilience Officer at 8 the pleasure of the Governor.

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- 9 (3) The State Resilience Officer shall:
- 10 (a) Perform the duties of the office, as determined by the Governor, in consultation with

11 the Director of the Oregon Department of Administrative Services.

(b) Provide leadership in achieving the mission of the Seismic Safety Policy Advisory
Commission functions described in ORS 401.918.

(c) Provide assistance and direction to the Oregon Business Development Department to
implement the seismic rehabilitation grant program established in ORS 401.910.

(d) Monitor the actions of state agencies to ensure that agency action furthers the
resilience goals of this state.

18 (4) The State Resilience Officer shall also:

(a) Adopt by rule a state resilience plan and update the plan each biennium. In developing
the plan, the officer shall consult with and consider the recommendations of state agencies
and local governments, private sector experts and the Legislative Fiscal Officer.

(b) Identify and recommend to the director the resources that are necessary to imple ment the plan adopted under paragraph (a) of this subsection. The director shall consider the
recommendations of the State Resilience Officer under this paragraph in developing a
biennial budget for the department.

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
