# House Bill 2587

Sponsored by Representative BARNHART (Presession filed.)

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Defines "natural nail care." Specifies that person who is certified to practice nail technology is authorized to practice natural nail care.

Makes natural nail care subject to regulatory authority of Board of Cosmetology, Health Licensing Office and Higher Education Coordinating Commission.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to natural nail care; creating new provisions; amending ORS 345.010, 345.400, 345.430,

345.440, 345.450, 348.290, 690.005, 690.015, 690.046, 690.165 and 690.167; and declaring an emergency.

5 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

6 **SECTION 1.** ORS 690.005 is amended to read:

7 690.005. As used in ORS 690.005 to 690.225:

8 (1) "Barbering" means any of the following practices, when done upon the human body for cos-

9 metic purposes and not for medical diagnosis or treatment of disease or physical or mental ailments:

10 (a) Shampooing, styling, cutting, singeing and conditioning of the hair of an individual.

11 (b) Applying hair tonics, dressings and rinses.

(c) Massaging of the scalp, face and neck and applying facial and scalp treatments with creams,
 lotions, oils and other cosmetic preparations, either by hand or mechanical appliances, except that

14 the mechanical appliances may not be galvanic or faradic.

15 (d) Shaving, trimming or cutting of the beard or mustache.

16 (2) "Certificate" means a written authorization for the holder to perform in one or more fields 17 of practice.

(3) "Cosmetology" means the art or science of beautifying and improving the skin, nails and hairand the study of cosmetics and their application.

20 (4) "Demonstration permit" means a written authorization for a person to practice, demonstrate 21 and teach one or more fields of practice on a temporary basis.

(5) "Esthetics" means any of the following skin care or facial care practices performed on the
human body or face for the purpose of keeping the skin of the human body or face healthy and attractive and not for medical diagnosis or treatment of disease or physical or mental ailments:

(a) The use of the hands or mechanical or electric apparatuses or appliances for cleansing,
 stimulating, manipulating, exfoliating or applying lotions or creams.

- 27 (b) Temporary removal of hair.
- 28 (c) Makeup artistry.

29 (d) Eyelash services.

30 (e) Facial and body wrapping.

**NOTE:** Matter in **boldfaced** type in an amended section is new; matter [*italic and bracketed*] is existing law to be omitted. New sections are in **boldfaced** type.

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1 (f) Facial and body waxing.

2 (6) "Facility" means an establishment operated on a regular or irregular basis for the purpose

3 of providing services in one or more fields of practice.

4 (7) "Field of practice" means the following cosmetology disciplines:

5 (a) Barbering.

6 (b) Esthetics.

7 (c) Hair design.

8 (d) Nail technology.

9 (e) Natural hair care.

10 (f) Natural nail care.

(8) "Freelance license" means a written authorization that allows a practitioner to practice
 outside or away from a licensed facility.

(9) "Hair design" means any of the following practices, when done upon the human body for
cosmetic purposes and not for medical diagnosis or treatment of disease or physical or mental
ailments:

16 (a) Shaving, trimming or cutting of the beard or mustache.

(b) Styling, permanent waving, relaxing, cutting, singeing, bleaching, coloring, shampooing, con ditioning, applying hair products or similar work upon the hair of an individual.

(c) Massaging the scalp and neck when performed in conjunction with activities in paragraph(a) or (b) of this subsection.

(10) "Independent contractor" means a practitioner who qualifies as an independent contractor
 under ORS 670.600 and who is not under the control and direction of a facility license holder.

(11) "License" means a written authorization issued under ORS 690.055 to a person to operate
 a facility or freelance business for providing services related to one or more fields of practice to the
 public.

(12) "Nail technology" means any of the following manicuring or pedicuring practices performed
 for cosmetic purposes and not for medical diagnosis or treatment of disease or physical or mental
 ailments:

(a) Cutting, trimming, polishing, coloring, tinting, cleansing or otherwise treating the nails of thehands or feet.

(b) Massaging, cleansing, treating or beautifying the hands, arms below the elbow, feet or legs
 below the knee.

33 (c) Applying, sculpturing or removing artificial nails of the hands or feet.

34 (13)(a) "Natural hair care" means:

(A) The braiding, cornrowing, extending, lacing, locking, sewing, twisting, weaving or wrapping
 of human hair, natural fibers, synthetic fibers or hair extensions through the use of hands or simple
 devices such as clips, combs, hairpins or needle and thread;

(B) The use of scissors to trim synthetic fibers, hair extensions or sewn-in weave extensions as
is necessary to perform the activities described in this paragraph; or

40 (C) The making of customized wigs from natural hair, natural fibers, synthetic fibers or hair 41 extensions.

(b) "Natural hair care" does not include the use of scissors, except as provided in paragraph
(a)(B) of this subsection, penetrating chemical hair treatments, chemical hair coloring agents,
chemical hair straightening agents, chemical hair joining agents, permanent wave styles or chemical
hair bleaching agents.

(14)(a) "Natural nail care" means any of the following manicuring or pedicuring practices 1 2 performed for cosmetic purposes and not for medical diagnosis or treatment of disease or physical or mental ailments: 3 (A) Cutting, trimming, polishing, coloring, tinting, cleansing or otherwise treating the 4 nails of the hands or feet.  $\mathbf{5}$ (B) Massaging, cleansing, treating or beautifying the hands, arms below the elbow, feet 6 or legs below the knees. 7 (C) The use of gel polish on the nails of the hands or feet. 8 9 (b) "Natural nail care" does not include applying, sculpturing or removing artificial nails, such as nail tips or forms, sculptured monomers and polymers or ultraviolet gel nails, of the 10 hands or feet. 11 12[(14)] (15) "Practitioner" means a person certified to perform services included within a field of practice. 13 [(15)] (16) "Registration" means a written authorization issued to an independent contractor to 14 15 hold forth to the public as a business entity providing services in a field of practice. 16 [(16)] (17) "School" means an educational establishment that has a license issued by the Department of Education and is operated for the purpose of teaching one or more fields of practice. 17 18 For purposes of this subsection, "field of practice" does not include natural hair care. 19 [(17)] (18) "Temporary facility permit" means a written authorization issued under ORS 690.055 20 to provide services on a temporary basis in one or more fields of practice. SECTION 2. ORS 690.015 is amended to read: 2122690.015. (1) This section establishes prohibitions relating to the practice of hair design, barbering, esthetics, nail technology, [and] natural hair care and natural nail care. The prohibitions un-23der this section are subject to the exemptions under ORS 690.025. A person who commits an act 94 prohibited under this section is subject to the penalties under ORS 690.992 in addition to any ad-25ministrative action taken by or any civil penalty imposed by the Health Licensing Office under ORS 2627676.612. 28(2) A person may not: (a) Perform or attempt to perform services in a field of practice without an active certificate, 2930 demonstration permit, registration or freelance license. 31 (b) Operate a facility without a license or temporary facility permit. (c) Perform or attempt to perform services in a field of practice outside a licensed facility or 32temporary facility unless the person holds a freelance license issued under ORS 690.123. 33 34 (d) Practice hair design, barbering, esthetics, nail technology, [or] natural hair care or natural 35**nail care** as an independent contractor without a registration. (e) Display a sign or in any way advertise or purport to offer services in a field of practice 36 37 without first obtaining a permit, certificate, independent contractor registration or facility license. 38 (f) Knowingly make a false statement on an application to obtain or renew a certificate, registration, license or permit. 39 (g) Allow an individual in the employ or under the supervision or control of the person to per-40 form in a field of practice without a certificate or permit. 41 (h) Sell, barter or offer to sell or barter a document evidencing a certificate, registration, license 42 43 or permit. (i) Purchase or procure by barter a document evidencing a certificate with intent to use it as 44

45 evidence of the person's qualification as a practitioner.

(j) Materially alter with fraudulent intent a document evidencing a certificate, registration, li-1 2 cense or permit. (k) Use or attempt to use a fraudulently obtained, counterfeited or materially altered document 3 evidencing a certificate, registration, license or permit. 4  $\mathbf{5}$ SECTION 3. ORS 690.046 is amended to read: 690.046. (1) To qualify for certification as a practitioner of hair design, barbering, esthetics, nail 6 technology, [or] natural hair care or natural nail care, an applicant shall: 7 (a) If the applicant is applying for certification to practice hair design, barbering, esthetics or 8 9 nail technology, successfully complete all courses required by rule of the State Board of Education for graduation from a school teaching one or more fields of practice. 10 (b) If the applicant is applying for certification to practice natural nail care, successfully 11 12 complete all courses required by rule of the State Board of Education for graduation from 13 a school teaching one or more fields of practice, except that the applicant is not required to complete those courses relating to the application, sculpturing or removal of artificial nails 14 15 of the hands and feet. 16 [(b)] (c) Successfully pass the certification examination approved, administered or recognized by the Board of Cosmetology for the field of practice in which certification is sought. 17 18 [(c)] (d) Pay the applicable fees established under ORS 676.592. 19 [(d)] (e) Meet any additional requirements the Board of Cosmetology may impose by rule for 20 certification in a particular field of practice. (2) A person who is certified to practice hair design or barbering under this section is author-2122ized to practice natural hair care. 23(3) A person who is certified to practice nail technology under this section is authorized to practice natural nail care. 24 25SECTION 4. ORS 690.165 is amended to read: 690.165. In addition to the powers otherwise granted by ORS 345.430 and 690.005 to 690.225, the 2627Board of Cosmetology shall have the power to: (1) Determine whether applicants are qualified to take certification examinations. 28(2) Administer, approve or recognize certification examinations and designate the time, place 2930 and administrators of certification examinations. 31 (3) Contract for the administration of examinations as part of regional or national examinations and contract with independent testing services for examination administration. 32(4) Pursuant to ORS 676.586, direct the Health Licensing Office to issue certificates, registra-33 34 tions, licenses and permits to individuals determined by the board to be qualified. (5) Except as otherwise provided in ORS 690.205 (2) or other provision of law, adopt rules es-35tablishing and enforcing standards for safety, infection control, professional conduct and any other 36 37 matters relating to fields of practice, facilities or locations used by persons providing services reg-38 ulated by ORS 690.005 to 690.225. 5	690.167. In the manner prescribed in ORS chapter 183 for contested cases and at the direction
6	of the Board of Cosmetology, the Health Licensing Office may impose a form of discipline listed in
7	ORS 676.612 against any person practicing barbering, hair design, esthetics, nail technology, [or]
8	natural hair care or natural nail care for any of the grounds listed in ORS 676.612 and for any
9	violation of the provisions of ORS 690.005 to 690.225, or the rules adopted thereunder.
10	<b>SECTION 6.</b> ORS 345.010 is amended to read:
11	345.010. As used in ORS 345.010 to 345.450 and 345.992 to 345.997:
12	(1) "Agent" means an individual who is employed by or for a career school, or is working on
13	behalf of the school under a contract, for the purpose of actively procuring students, enrollees or
14	subscribers of the school by solicitation in any form that is made at a place or places other than
15	the school office or place of business of the school.
16	(2) "Barbering" has the meaning given that term in ORS 690.005.
17	(3) "Career school" or "school" means any private proprietary professional, technical, home
18	study, correspondence, business or other school instruction, organization or person that offers any
19	instruction or training for the purpose or purported purpose of instructing, training or preparing
20	persons for any profession.
21	(4) "Esthetics" has the meaning given in ORS 690.005.
22	(5) "Hair design" has the meaning given in ORS 690.005.
23	(6) "License" means the authority the career school has been granted to operate under ORS
24	345.010 to 345.450.
25	(7) "Nail technology" has the meaning given in ORS 690.005.
26	(8) "Natural nail care" has the meaning given in ORS 690.005.
27	[(8)] (9) "Registration" means the approval by the Higher Education Coordinating Commission

29	SECTION 7. ORS 345.400 is amended to read:
30	345.400. In addition to the other requirements of ORS 345.010 to 345.450, the rules adopted by
31	the Higher Education Coordinating Commission to regulate schools teaching hair design, barbering,
32	esthetics, [or] nail technology or natural nail care:
33	(1) May include rules the commission considers necessary to protect the economic or physical
34	health and safety of the public and of the students attending the school including compliance with
35	ORS 345.110.
36	(2) Shall include rules that set standards for teachers teaching in schools licensed to teach hair
37	design, barbering, esthetics, [or] nail technology or natural nail care pursuant to ORS 345.010 to
38	345.450.
39	(3) Shall require the schools to teach, and require for graduation from the school, courses that
40	meet the following minimum standards:
41	(a)(A) A minimum hourly training requirement for:
42	(i) Hair design, 1,450 hours;

The Higher Education Coordinating Commission shall determine whether a person from 12 out-of-state who is not certified in hair design, barbering, esthetics, [or] nail technology or natural 13 nail care by another state or a person from out-of-country seeking a certificate in hair design, 14 barbering, esthetics, [or] nail technology or natural nail care is qualified to take the test of the 15 Board of Cosmetology. A determination shall be made by an evaluation of academic transcripts, 16 apprenticeship records and work experience documentation. If documentation is not available, the 17 commission may refer the person to a career school for evaluation and recommendation.

18 **SECTION 9.** ORS 345.440 is amended to read:

345.440. Safety and sanitation inspections performed in schools licensed under ORS 345.010 to
345.450 to teach hair design, barbering, esthetics, [or] nail technology or natural nail care shall
be conducted by the Health Licensing Office.

22 SECTION 10. ORS 345.450 is amended to read:

345.450. (1) In addition to the fees required by ORS 345.080, before issuing any license under
ORS 345.010 to 345.450 to a school teaching hair design, barbering, esthetics, [or] nail technology
or natural nail care, and annually thereafter, the Higher Education Coordinating Commission shall
collect a nonrefundable annual inspection fee of \$100.

(2) The inspection fee collected under subsection (1) of this section shall be transferred to the
 Health Licensing Office for inspections performed by the office under ORS 345.440.

29 SECTION 11. ORS 348.290 is amended to read:

30 348.290. The Executive Director of the Office of Student Access and Completion shall apply the 31 interest on the amount transferred to the Oregon Student Assistance Fund under section 4, chapter 32 377, Oregon Laws 1985, to provide financial aid, as defined in ORS 348.505, to students to study 33 barbering, hairdressing, manicure, [and] esthetics **and natural nail care** at eligible post-secondary 34 schools.

 (1) The amendments to ORS 345.010, 345.400, 345.430, 345.440, 345.450,

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 348.290, 690.005, 690.015, 690.046, 690.165 and 690.167 by sections 1 to 11 of this 2015 Act become

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 operative on January 1, 2016.

(2) The Board of Cosmetology and the Health Licensing Office may take any action necessary before the operative date specified in subsection (1) of this section to enable the board
and the office to exercise, on or after the operative date specified in subsection (1) of this
section, all the duties, functions and powers conferred on the board and the office by the
amendments to ORS 345.010, 345.400, 345.430, 345.440, 345.450, 348.290, 690.005, 690.015, 690.046,
690.165 and 690.167 by sections 1 to 11 of this 2015 Act.
