

House Bill 2680

Sponsored by Representatives DOHERTY, MCLAIN (Pre-session filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Prohibits use of results of statewide summative assessment developed by state-led consortium to establish summative ratings of schools or to make summative evaluations of teachers or administrators.

Directs Superintendent of Public Instruction to convene work group related to statewide summative assessments developed by state-led consortium.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to statewide summative assessments; and declaring an emergency.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. (1) The results of a statewide summative assessment developed by a state-led consortium and administered during the 2014-2015 school year may not be used to establish summative ratings of schools or to make summative evaluations of teachers or administrators.

(2) The Superintendent of Public Instruction shall convene a work group to determine how to implement the results of a statewide summative assessment developed by a state-led consortium. The work group shall:

(a) Review the results of the assessment administered during the 2014-2015 school year and:

(A) Evaluate whether the assessment accurately measures student learning;

(B) Analyze student learning gaps; and

(C) Identify adjustments in instruction necessary to address student learning gaps.

(b) Issue findings and make recommendations for legislation in a report submitted to the State Board of Education and to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to education.

SECTION 2. This 2015 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2015 Act takes effect on its passage.
