House Bill 2696

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Requires Oregon Health Authority to collaborate with coordinated care organizations to develop uniform audit processes and forms to be used by authority and contractors of authority. Requires authority to collaborate with coordinated care organizations if processes or forms are modified.

| 11 | (c) A process through which the authority shares with its contractors the results of au- |
| 12 | dits conducted and the data reported in accordance with this subsection in order to avoid the |
| 13 | imposition of burdensome audits and duplicative reporting requirements on the coordinated |
| 14 | care organizations. |
| 15 | (2) Entities that contract with the authority may not conduct audits of coordinated care |
| 16 | organizations or require coordinated care organizations to report information in addition to |
| 17 | the audits performed and data reported in accordance with subsection (1) of this section. |
| 18 | (3) The authority shall collaborate with coordinated care organizations with respect to |
| 19 | any modifications to the processes or forms adopted under subsection (1) of this section. |
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
