## House Bill 2951

Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON HEALTH CARE

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Requires policies and certificates of health insurance that offer prescription drug coverage to meet specified cost-sharing requirements.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT Relating to insurance coverage of prescription drugs. Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2015 Act is added to and made a part of the Insurance Code. SECTION 2. A policy or certificate of health insurance offered in this state that provides payment or reimbursement for the cost of prescription drugs is subject to all of the following requirements: (1) The combined cost of copayments and coinsurance for a 30-day supply of a prescription drug may not exceed \$100. (2) Prescription drugs may not be subject to a deductible. (3) The cost of copayments and coinsurance for covered prescription drugs must apply to any deductible. (4) All drugs within a therapeutic or pharmacological class may not be made subject to the cost tier for which an enrollee incurs the highest out-of-pocket costs. (5) There must be a process for an enrollee to obtain an exception to any coverage limitation or cost-sharing that is based on a drug not being on a formulary or preferred drug list. SECTION 3. Section 2 of this 2015 Act applies to policies and certificates of insurance issued, extended or renewed on or after the effective date of this 2015 Act.

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
