## House Bill 3108

Sponsored by Representative NEARMAN; Representatives BARRETO, ESQUIVEL, KRIEGER, POST, SMITH, WEIDNER

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Requires state agencies and persons that contract with state agencies to use federal E-Verify employment verification system to verify employment eligibility of job applicants. Instructs state agencies to report use of E-Verify system to Oregon Department of Administrative Services. Requires department to report annually to Legislative Assembly on use of E-Verify system by state agencies. Authorizes department to adopt rules.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to use of the E-Verify employment verification system in public employment.

**Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:** 

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) All state agencies and persons that contract with state agencies shall

5 use the federal E-Verify employment verification system to verify the eligibility for employ-

6 ment in the United States of all employees.

7 (2) Each state agency shall report on the agency's use of the E-Verify employment ver-

8 ification system, for each fiscal year ending June 30, to the Oregon Department of Adminis-

9 trative Services. The annual report shall include, but is not limited to:

(a) The total number of requests for verification made through the E-Verify system in
the reporting period;

12 (b) The number of applicants verified as eligible for employment;

(c) The number of applicants for which eligibility for employment could not be verified;
and

(d) The classification of the position applied for by each applicant for employment.

(3) The department shall report annually by September 15, in the manner provided in
ORS 192.245, to the Legislative Assembly. The report must include a summary of the reports
submitted to the department by state agencies under subsection (2) of this section for the
preceding fiscal year ending June 30.

20 (4) The department shall adopt rules necessary for the implementation and adminis-21 tration of this section.

22 (5) As used in this section, "state agency" means any state officer, board, commission,

department, institution or agency of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, and the

24 Oregon Health and Science University and public universities listed in ORS 352.002.

25 <u>SECTION 2.</u> Section 1 of this 2015 Act becomes operative on July 1, 2016.

26 <u>SECTION 3.</u> Section 1 of this 2015 Act applies to employees hired after July 1, 2016.

27 <u>SECTION 4.</u> The first report from the Oregon Department of Administrative Services

required by section 1 (3) of this 2015 Act shall be submitted no later than September 15, 2017.

29 <u>SECTION 5.</u> The Director of the Oregon Department of Administrative Services may take

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- 1 any action before the operative date specified in section 2 of this 2015 Act that is necessary
- 2 to enable the Oregon Department of Administrative Services to exercise, on or after the
- 3 operative date specified in section 2 of this 2015 Act, the duties, functions and powers con-
- 4 ferred on the department by section 1 of this 2015 Act.

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
