SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

[Establishes Task Force on Mobile Medical Clinics. Specifies membership and duties.] [Sunsets task force on December 31, 2016.] [Declares emergency, effective on passage.]

Prohibits local government from preventing mobile medical clinic from locating to private property for not more than 180 days.

2	Relating to mobile medical clinics.
3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. (1) As used in this section:
5	(a) "Health professional" means a person licensed or certified by the:
6	(A) Oregon Medical Board;
7	(B) Oregon Board of Dentistry; or
8	(C) Oregon State Board of Nursing.
9	(b) "Health services" means the services that a health professional is licensed or certified
10	to provide.
11	(c) "Local government" has the meaning given that term in ORS 174.116.
12	(d) "Mobile medical clinic" means a vehicle or a transportable structure that is:
13	(A) Designed to serve as a facility suitable for the provision of health services; and
14	(B) In use by a health professional to provide health services to the public.
15	(e) "Nonprofit" means a corporation organized under and subject to the provisions of
16	ORS chapter 65.
17	(2) A local government may not prohibit a nonprofit mobile medical clinic from:
18	(a) Being located on private property with the permission of the owner of the private
19	property; and
20	(b) Staying in one location for 180 days or less.
