House Bill 3352

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Requires Oregon Health Authority to provide for specified drug and alcohol treatment programs.

A BILL FOR AN ACT
Relating to behavioral health treatment.
Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
SECTION 1. (1) The Oregon Health Authority shall contract with public or private enti-
ties to provide alcohol and drug treatment services to individuals who meet the financial el-
igibility requirements for medical assistance. The services shall include, at a minimum:
(a) Intensive inpatient treatment services;
(b) Drug and alcohol free housing, as described in ORS 90.243; and
(c) Outpatient treatment and counseling, including assistance in obtaining employment,
and a living allowance while undergoing treatment.
(2) The living allowance provided under subsection (1)(c) of this section:
(a) May not be used to pay for shelter to individuals living in a dormitory setting if the
setting does not require sobriety as a condition of residence.
(b) Shall be administered on the individual's behalf by the outpatient treatment facility
or other social service agency designated by the authority.
(3) The authority may pay an outpatient treatment facility or other social service agency
a fee for administering the living allowance for an individual receiving treatment.
(4) An applicant for alcohol and drug treatment services under this section may be re-
quired to complete a course of inpatient treatment prior to receiving outpatient treatment
and counseling, if the treatment provider determines it is necessary to the success of the
outpatient treatment.
