SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Requires certain persons to not drive in far left lane unless passing. Provides exceptions. Punishes by maximum fine of \$1,000.

Clarifies that certain persons must drive in far right lane.

2	Relating to lane of travel; creating new provisions; and amending ORS 811.325.
3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2015 Act is added to and made a part of the Oregon Vehicle
5	Code.
6	SECTION 2. (1) A person commits the offense of failure to keep a vehicle in the right
7	lane if the person is operating a vehicle and the person drives the vehicle in the far left lane
8	on a roadway that has two or more lanes for traffic proceeding in a single direction and that
9	has a speed limit or posted speed greater than 45 miles per hour.
10	(2) A person may drive in the far left lane:
11	(a) When overtaking and passing another vehicle proceeding in the same direction under
12	the rules governing this movement in ORS 811.410 to 811.425 when such movement can be
13	made without interfering with the passage of other vehicles.
14	(b) When preparing to turn left.
15	(c) When reasonably necessary in response to emergency conditions.
16	(d) To avoid actual or potential traffic moving onto the right lane from an acceleration
17	or merging lane.
18	(e) When necessary to follow traffic control devices that direct use of a lane.
19	(f) When the flow of traffic is moving slower than the normal flow of traffic at the time
20	and place and under the conditions then existing.
21	(3) This section does not apply to persons driving the following vehicles, which are gov-
22	erned by ORS 811.325:
23	(a) Any camper.
24	(b) Any vehicle with a trailer.
25	(c) Any vehicle with a registration weight of 10,000 pounds or more.
26	(4) The offense described in this section, failure to keep a vehicle in the right lane, is a
27	Class B traffic violation.

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811.325. (1) A person commits the offense of failure to keep a camper, trailer or truck in the 1 $\mathbf{2}$ right lane if the person is operating any of the vehicles described in this subsection and the person does not drive in the far right lane of all roadways having two or more lanes for traffic proceeding 3 in a single direction. This subsection applies to all of the following vehicles: 4 (a) Any camper. 5 (b) Any vehicle with a trailer. 6 (c) Any vehicle with a registration weight of 10,000 pounds or more. 7 (2) This section does not require the described vehicles to be driven in the right lane under any 8 9 of the following circumstances: (a) When overtaking and passing another vehicle proceeding in the same direction under the 10 rules governing this movement in ORS 811.410 to 811.425 when such movement can be made without 11 12 interfering with the passage of other vehicles. (b) When preparing to turn left. 13 (c) When reasonably necessary in response to emergency conditions. 14 15 (d) To avoid actual or potential traffic moving onto the right lane from an acceleration or merging lane. 16 (e) When necessary to follow traffic control devices that direct use of a lane other than the right 17lane. 18 19 (3) The offense described in this section, failure to keep camper, trailer or truck in the right lane, is a Class B traffic violation. 20SECTION 4. Section 2 of this 2015 Act and the amendments to ORS 811.325 by section 3 2122of this 2015 Act apply to offenses occurring on or after the effective date of this 2015 Act. 23
