House Bill 3420

Sponsored by Representative HOYLE, Senator GELSER; Representative OLSON

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Directs Housing and Community Services Department, with advice of State Housing Council and in collaboration with Community Action Partnership of Oregon and Department of Human Services, to develop, implement and administer Housing First Program for purpose of providing housing assistance, case management and support services to individuals and families experiencing homelessness by utilizing continuum of care.

Creates Housing First Program Fund. Continuously appropriates moneys to Housing and Community Services Department.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to assistance for persons experiencing homelessness; and declaring an emergency.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> The Legislative Assembly finds and declares that:

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5 (1) Many Oregon communities engage in planning that manages the condition of 6 homelessness rather than planning to end the condition of homelessness.

7 (2) Efforts to manage homelessness in the past several decades have involved public and 8 private solutions that focus on providing individuals and families who are experiencing 9 homelessness with either emergency shelter or transitional housing, or both. While such 10 efforts provide critical access to temporary housing and services for individuals and families 11 in crisis, these efforts fail to address long-term needs.

(3) Ending child homelessness in Oregon is a goal that is urgent and achievable through 12 the provision of a continuum of care for children and their families. Efforts to end child 13 14 homelessness must be coordinated across traditional areas of practice and governmental structures to provide the most effective network of support and opportunities for children 1516 who are experiencing homelessness and to ensure that resources are distributed effectively 17 and strategically. Stakeholders and state agencies that provide services to children, including but not limited to the Department of Human services, must collaborate to develop and im-18 plement practices that reduce the number of children and young adults who experience 19 20 homelessness while in, or after leaving, the child welfare or juvenile justice system.

(4) The Housing First Program established under section 3 of this 2015 Act is an alternative to current approaches to dealing with homelessness that is intended to be more cost-effective and to reduce the length of time that individuals and families experience homelessness.

(5) Oregon will benefit from different approaches to care for individuals and families experiencing homelessness, ranging from current approaches that address the short-term, critical needs of such persons to the Housing First Program that addresses the long-term needs of these persons.

1	SECTION 2. As used in sections 1 to 3 of this 2015 Act:
2	(1) "Continuum of care" means an approach to provide housing assistance, case man-
3	agement and support services that meets the specific, noncritical needs of individuals and
4	families experiencing homelessness after initial, critical housing needs have been met and
5	as these persons move toward the goal of stable housing and maximum self-sufficiency, with
6	the ultimate objective being to end homelessness and to prevent a return to homelessness
7	for these persons.
8	(2)(a) "Homelessness" means:
9	(A) Living in one of the following conditions:
10	(i) Lacking a fixed, regular, adequate and habitable nighttime residence; or
11	(ii) Having a primary nighttime residence that is:
12	(I) Housing shared with another person due to loss of housing or economic hardship;
13	(II) A motel, hotel, travel trailer as defined in ORS 801.565 or campground, due to lack
14	of alternative housing;
15	(III) An emergency or transitional shelter;
16	(IV) A public or private shelter designed to provide temporary living accommodations,
17	including but not limited to hotels for persons receiving welfare benefits and transitional
18	housing for persons with mental illness;
19	(V) An institution that provides temporary residence for individuals who have been or
20	will be institutionalized under the laws of this state;
21	(VI) A public or private place that is not designed for or ordinarily used as regular
22	sleeping accommodations for human beings; or
23	(VII) A car, park, public space, abandoned building, bus or train station or other similar
24	setting not intended for human habitation.
25	(B) Being migratory and living under one or more of the conditions listed in subpara-
26	graph (A)(ii) of this paragraph.
27	(C) Being released from a jail, a prison, the juvenile justice system, the child welfare
28	system, a mental health facility, a facility for persons with developmental disabilities, a res-
29	idential addiction treatment program or a hospital, with no subsequent residence identified
30	or provided and lacking the resources and support to obtain housing.
31	(b) "Homelessness" does not mean being imprisoned or otherwise detained pursuant to
32	state or federal law or to sharing housing due to cultural preferences, voluntary arrange-
33	ments or traditional networks of support.
34	SECTION 3. (1) The Housing and Community Services Department, with the advice of the
35	State Housing Council and in collaboration with the Community Action Partnership of
36	Oregon and the Department of Human Services, shall develop, implement and administer the
37	Housing First Program for the purpose of providing housing assistance, case management
38	and support services to individuals and families experiencing homelessness by utilizing a
39	continuum of care.
40	(2) The continuum of care utilized by the program must include, at a minimum, the fol-
41	lowing:
42	(a) Crisis intervention and short-term stabilization;
43	(b) Screening, intake and needs assessment;
44	(c) Housing assistance that is not time-limited and not contingent on compliance with
45	support services;

(e) Support services provided through community-based social service, educational and

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(d) Case management; and

health care programs and entities, as necessary to make possible the success of participants 3 in avoiding homelessness on a permanent basis. 4 (3) In consultation with the Community Action Partnership of Oregon, the Housing and 5 Community Services Department shall contract with community action agencies described 6 in ORS 458.505 that the department determines are eligible to implement the continuum of 7 care in the area served by the community action agency. 8 9 (4) The contract between a community action agency and the Housing and Community Services Department to implement the continuum of care shall, at a minimum, provide that 10 the community action agency shall: 11 12(a) Provide screening, intake and needs assessment to identify individuals and families who are eligible to participate in the Housing First Program based upon likelihood of success, 13 need and other factors as set forth in rules adopted by the department; 14 15 (b) Assist eligible participants to obtain housing and to enter into standard lease agreements for housing; 16 (c) Provide case management and support services as appropriate to make less likely a 1718 state of homelessness or a return to homelessness for participants; and 19 (d) Provide information to the department as identified in rules adopted by the department to ensure that the continuum of care is being implemented and that the objectives of 20the program are being achieved. 2122(5) In implementing the Housing First Program and to the extent possible, the State 23Housing Council, the Housing and Community Services Department and the Department of **Human Services shall:** 94 (a) Prioritize state and federal funding opportunities that support efforts to reduce and 25end homelessness through the continuum of care implemented by the program; 2627(b) Identify and implement initiatives and other programs that: (A) Increase the supply of rental housing needed to meet the demand for housing for 28individuals and families who are experiencing or may experience homelessness; and 2930 (B) Increase the availability of employment opportunities for individuals who are experi-31 encing homelessness; (c) Train homelessness specialists and place them in centers that are easily accessed by 32individuals and families experiencing homelessness; and 33 34 (d) Contract with a state institution of higher education to research and document the costs of homelessness in this state, including but not limited to the costs incurred by law 35enforcement agencies, courts, jails and hospitals responding to situations involving individ-36 37 uals and families experiencing homelessness, for the purpose of obtaining recommendations 38 on how best to allocate public funds to prevent and end homelessness. (6) The Housing and Community Services Department, in consultation with the Commu-39 nity Action Partnership of Oregon, shall adopt rules to implement the provisions of this 40 section. 41 SECTION 4. (1) There is created within the State Treasury, separate and distinct from 42 the General Fund, the Housing First Program Fund. Interest earned by the Housing First 43 Program Fund shall be credited to the fund. 44 (2) Moneys in the Housing First Program Fund shall consist of: 45

(a) Amounts donated to the fund; 1 2 (b) Amounts appropriated or otherwise transferred to the fund by the Legislative As-3 sembly; (c) Investment earnings received on moneys in the fund; and 4 $\mathbf{5}$ (d) Other amounts deposited in the fund from any source. (3) Moneys in the fund are continuously appropriated to the Housing and Community 6 Services Department to carry out the provisions of sections 1 to 3 of this 2015 Act. 7 (4) The department may use moneys in the fund to pay the administrative costs associ-8 9 ated with the fund and with carrying out the provisions of sections 1 to 3 of this 2015 Act. SECTION 5. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropri-10 ated to the Housing and Community Services Department, for the biennium beginning July 11 121, 2015, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$_____, which may be expended for purposes of implementing and administering the Housing First Program established under sec-13 tion 3 of this 2015 Act. 14 15SECTION 6. This 2015 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 16 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2015 Act takes effect on its passage. 17
