<u>SECTION 10.</u> For the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, expenditures by the Higher Education Coordinating Commission for federal funds debt service on Build America Bonds sold
 for the benefit of Oregon public universities and community colleges are not limited.

12 "<u>SECTION 11.</u> For the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, expenditures by the Higher Edu-13 cation Coordinating Commission of moneys from the Tuition Protection Fund are not limited. 14 "<u>SECTION 12.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of 15 \$8,240,000 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, as the maximum limit for 16 payment of expenses from lottery moneys allocated to the Higher Education Coordinating 17 Commission from the Sports Lattery Account for the heavily of Oregon public universities.

"SECTION 13. This 2015 Act being necessary for the immediate protection of the public
