## **House Concurrent Resolution 14**

Sponsored by Representative KENY-GUYER, Senator WINTERS

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Designates March 26, 2015, as Purple Day to raise awareness of epilepsy.

1	CONCURRENT RESOLUTION
<b>2</b>	Whereas epilepsy is a neurological disorder producing brief disturbances in the normal electrical
3	functions of the brain that temporarily affect a person's consciousness, bodily movements or sensa-
4	tions, while resulting in long-term effects on the lifestyle of individuals with epilepsy; and
5	Whereas 1 in 26 persons will develop epilepsy and 1 in 10 persons will have an epileptic seizure
6	during the person's lifetime; and
7	Whereas it is estimated that 50 million people worldwide and over 37,000 people in Oregon are
8	living with epilepsy; and
9	Whereas epilepsy can affect anyone regardless of gender, race, age, religion, educational back-
10	ground or socioeconomic status; and
11	Whereas the public is often unable to recognize common seizure types or to respond with ap-
12	propriate first aid; and
13	Whereas there is no known cure for epilepsy, which is a complex disorder that requires further
14	research to find a cure and prevention methods; and
15	Whereas the annual observance of Purple Day on March 26 brings attention to the need to ad-
16	vocate for the rights, humane treatment and appropriate education of all persons with epilepsy,
17	while raising awareness among families, professionals and the general public so that they may better
18	understand this lifelong disorder; now, therefore,
19	Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:
20	That we, the members of the Seventy-eighth Legislative Assembly, proclaim March 26, 2015, as
21	Purple Day; and be it further
22	Resolved, That we invite all Oregonians to participate in Purple Day by wearing purple, and
23	we call upon all citizens, government agencies, public and private institutions, businesses and
24	schools to recommit our communities to increasing awareness and understanding of epilepsy through
25	education while ensuring that all individuals with epilepsy are able to lead productive lives.
