Senate Bill 170

Sponsored by Senator BOQUIST (at the request of Rebekah McKinley) (Presession filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Requires school districts to provide firearm safety courses. Takes effect July 1, 2016.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to firearm safety education; and prescribing an effective date.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) Each school district shall ensure that age-appropriate firearm safety 5 courses are provided in all elementary schools, secondary schools and public charter schools

6 located in the school district.

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7 (2) Each course required under this section must:

8 (a) Be a minimum of one hour for students in kindergarten or grades 1 through 5 and a

9 minimum of two hours for students in grades 6 through 12, but may be provided over mul-10 tiple consecutive school days;

11 (b) Provide instruction in the appearance and workings of firearms, the proper response

12 to an emergency involving firearms and the proper response when a student sees a firearm;

13 (c) Allow the student the opportunity to handle an unloaded firearm;

14 (d) Be taught by a person who:

15 (A) Is a firearm safety instructor, a member of a city, county or state police agency, or

16 an active or reserve member of the military forces of this state or the United States;

- 17 (B) Has significant firearm experience;
- 18 (C) Is competent handling firearms; and
- 19 (D) Has volunteered to teach the class; and

20 (e) Be taught only by persons described in paragraph (d) of this subsection, in a ratio that 21 equals at least one person described in paragraph (d) of this subsection for:

22 (A) Every 10 students when the students are handling an unloaded firearm; and

(B) Every 20 students when the students are learning firearm safety that does not in volve the handling of an unloaded firearm.

(3)(a) Except as provided by paragraph (b) of this subsection, each student of the school
 district must attend at least one course described in this section each school year.

(b) A student may not be required to attend a course described in this section if the
parent or guardian of the student does not provide written permission for the student's
participation because the course is against the family's beliefs.

30 SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2015 Act first applies to the 2016-2017 school year.

31 SECTION 3. This 2015 Act takes effect July 1, 2016.
