## A-Engrossed Senate Bill 192

Ordered by the Senate April 7 Including Senate Amendments dated April 7

Sponsored by Senator FERRIOLI (Presession filed.)

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

[Permits Class I, Class II or Class IV all-terrain vehicles to be operated on highways under certain circumstances if equipped with certain equipment approved by Department of Transportation. Requires all-terrain vehicles operated on highways to fulfill financial responsibility requirements.]

Directs State Parks and Recreation Department to convene work group to examine options for allowing users of all-terrain vehicles to operate on state highways. Directs department to submit report to Legislative Assembly by September 15, 2016. Sunsets December 31, 2016.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to all-terrain vehicles.

**3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:** 

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) The State Parks and Recreation Department shall convene a work group

5 that includes users of all-terrain vehicles, all-terrain vehicle dealers, staff from the Depart-

6 ment of Transportation and other individuals whom the State Parks and Recreation Depart-

7 ment deems necessary, for the purpose of examining options for allowing users of all-terrain

8 vehicles to operate on state highways.

9 (2) The department shall compile a report, including any recommendations for legislation,
10 of the work group's conclusions.

(3) The department shall submit the report to the appropriate interim committee of the
Legislative Assembly, in the manner provided by ORS 192.245, not later than September 15,
2016.

14 SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2015 Act is repealed on December 31, 2016.
