SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

[Extends sunset on provision authorizing] Authorizes Department of Human Services to appear as party in juvenile court proceeding without appearance of Attorney General. Provides for gradual phaseout of authorization in specified counties by specified dates. Sunsets June 30, 2018.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

- Relating to appearance by attorney in juvenile court proceedings; creating new provisions; amending sections 2 and 3, chapter 106, Oregon Laws 2014; and declaring an emergency.
- 4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
- 5 **SECTION 1.** Section 2, chapter 106, Oregon Laws 2014, is amended to read:
- Sec. 2. Notwithstanding the provisions of ORS 9.320, 180.060 and 180.220, and subject to ORS 9.160 and section 3 of this 2015 Act, in a proceeding under this chapter, the Department of Human Services may appear without the Attorney General at:
 - (1) Any hearing held after the hearing required under ORS 419B.305 has been held; and
 - (2) Any proceeding where the district attorney represents the state, provided the positions of the department and the state are not in conflict with respect to issues raised for consideration or determination in the proceeding.
 - SECTION 2. Section 3, chapter 106, Oregon Laws 2014, is amended to read:
- Sec. 3. Section 2, chapter 106, Oregon Laws 2014, [of this 2014 Act] is repealed on June 30, [2015] 2018.
 - SECTION 3. (1) Except as provided in subsection (2) of this section, section 2, chapter 106, Oregon Laws 2014, applies to hearings or proceedings that occur on or after the effective date of chapter 106, Oregon Laws 2014.
 - (2) Section 2, chapter 106, Oregon Laws 2014, does not apply to hearings or proceedings that occur after:
 - (a) January 1, 2016, in Jackson, Josephine, Lane, Linn, Polk and Yamhill Counties;
 - (b) July 1, 2016, in Douglas, Klamath, Lake, Lincoln, Morrow and Umatilla Counties; and
- (c) July 1, 2017, in Benton, Clackamas, Clatsop, Columbia, Coos, Crook, Curry, Deschutes,
 Jefferson, Marion, Tillamook and Washington Counties.
 - (3) The provisions of this section are intended to effect the gradual phaseout of the policy

provided in section 2, chapter 106, Oregon Laws 2014.

SECTION 4. If this 2015 Act does not become effective until after June 30, 2015, the amendments to section 3, chapter 106, Oregon Laws 2014, by section 2 of this 2015 Act revive section 2, chapter 106, Oregon Laws 2014. If this 2015 Act does not become effective until after June 30, 2015, this 2015 Act shall be operative retroactively to that date, and the operation and effect of section 2, chapter 106, Oregon Laws 2014, shall continue unaffected from June 30, 2015, to the effective date of this 2015 Act. Any otherwise lawful action taken or otherwise lawful obligation incurred under the authority of section 2, chapter 106, Oregon Laws 2014, after June 30, 2015, and before the effective date of this 2015 Act, is ratified and approved.

<u>SECTION 5.</u> This 2015 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2015 Act takes effect on its passage.
