Senate Bill 227

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SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Authorizes establishment, from information maintained in Oregon Trauma Registry, of registry of information related to brain injury trauma.

Specifies additional circumstances under which individually identifiable information may be released from Oregon Trauma Registry.

Makes technical changes.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to use of information related to trauma injury; amending ORS 431.623 and 431.635.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 **SECTION 1.** ORS 431.623 is amended to read:

5 431.623. (1) The Emergency Medical Services and Trauma Systems Program is created within the

6 Oregon Health Authority for the [purpose of] following purposes:

- 7 (a) Administering and regulating ambulances[,];
- 8 (b) Training and licensing emergency medical services providers[,];
- 9 (c) Establishing and maintaining emergency medical systems, including trauma systems[,]; and
- 10 (d) Maintaining the Oregon Trauma Registry[, as necessary] for purposes related to trauma

11 reimbursement, system quality assurance and [ensuring] cost efficiency.

12 (2) [For purposes of ORS 431.575 to 431.619 and ORS chapter 682,] The duties vested in the au-

13 thority under ORS 431.575 to 431.619 and ORS chapter 682 shall be performed by the [Emergency

14 Medical Services and Trauma Systems] program.

15 (3) The program shall be administered by a director.

16 (4) [With moneys transferred to the program by ORS 442.625,] The director of the program shall

17 apply [those] moneys transferred to the program under ORS 442.625 to:

- 18 (a) Developing state and regional standards of care;
- 19 (b) Developing a statewide educational curriculum to teach standards of care;
- 20 (c) Implementing quality improvement programs;
- 21 (d) Creating a statewide data system for prehospital care; and
- (e) Providing ancillary services to enhance [Oregon's] this state's emergency medical service
 system.
- (5) The director of the program shall adopt rules for the Oregon Trauma Registry[,
 establishing:]. Rules adopted under this subsection must establish:
- (a) The information that must be reported by trauma centers to the program for inclusion in
 the Oregon Trauma Registry;
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(b) The form and frequency of reporting information under paragraph (a) of this

subsection; and 1 2 (c) Procedures and standards for the administration of the Oregon Trauma Registry. (6) The director of the program may adopt rules establishing, from information main-3 tained in the Oregon Trauma Registry, a registry of information related to brain injury 4 trauma. 5 SECTION 2. ORS 431.635 is amended to read: 6 7 431.635. (1) As used in this section, "individually identifiable information" means: (a) Individually identifiable health information as that term is defined in ORS 179.505; and 8 9 (b) Information that could be used to identify a health care provider, ambulance service medical transportation agency or health care facility. 10 (2) Notwithstanding ORS 431.627, individually identifiable information may be released from the 11 12 Oregon Trauma Registry: 13 (a) For use in executive session to conduct specific case reviews by: (A) The State Trauma Advisory Board or any area trauma advisory board; 14 15 (B) The State Emergency Medical Service Committee; or (C) The Emergency Medical Services for Children Advisory Committee. 16 (b) To the Oregon Health Authority for purposes related to the administration of public 17 health programs, including: 18 19 (A) The establishment of a registry of information related to brain injury trauma as de-20scribed in ORS 431.623 (6); and (B) The performance of epidemiological investigations of the causes of and risk factors 2122associated with trauma injuries. 23[(b)] (c) [For quality assurance or quality improvement purposes] To an emergency medical services provider or a designated trauma center for purposes related to quality of service assurance 24 and improvement, if the information is related to the treatment of an individual by the provider 25or center. 2627(d) To the Department of Human Services for purposes related to enabling the department to plan for and provide services to individuals adversely affected by trauma injuries, 28if the department agrees to use the information only for the purposes described in this par-2930 agraph and to maintain the confidentiality of the information. 31 [(c)] (e) To a person conducting research [only] if: (A) An institutional review board has approved the research in accordance with 45 C.F.R. part 3246; and 33 34 (B) The person agrees to maintain the confidentiality of the information. (3) The Oregon Health Authority may release only the minimum amount of individually iden-35tifiable information necessary to carry out the purposes for which [it] the information is released 36 37 under this section. 38

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
