Senate Bill 287

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SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Deletes provision that authorizes teachers who are licensed and properly endorsed by Teacher Standards and Practices Commission to practice speech-language pathology without obtaining license from State Board of Examiners for Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology.

Becomes operative July 1, 2016.

Creates grandfather clause for teachers who are licensed and properly endorsed before July 1, 2016.

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A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to persons who may practice speech-language pathology without a license; creating new
 provisions; and amending ORS 681.230.

4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

5 **SECTION 1.** ORS 681.230 is amended to read:

6 681.230. (1) Without obtaining a license under this chapter, a person may use [any] **a** procedure

7 included in the practice of speech-language pathology or audiology if the procedure is within the

8 **person's** scope of practice [of the person] and the person is:

9 (a) Licensed by a health professional regulatory board as defined in ORS 676.160;

(b) Performing basic audiometric testing under the supervision of a physician licensed under
 ORS chapter 677 and representing that the person is a medical assistant or audiology assistant;

12 (c) A teacher who is licensed by the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission and 13 [holding] who holds a hearing impaired endorsement issued by the commission; [or]

(d) A student participating in supervised field work or supervised course work in speechlanguage pathology or audiology as part of a college or university program approved by the State
Board of Examiners for Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology; or

(e) A student taking an undergraduate course in speech-language pathology approved by the
 board.

(2) A person practicing speech-language pathology or audiology without a license under sub section (1) of this section may not represent or imply that the person is a speech-language
 pathologist, speech-language pathology assistant or audiologist.

(3) A person practicing speech-language pathology or audiology without a license under sub section (1)(d) or (e) of this section:

24 (a) Must use a title that indicates that the person is a student trainee.

(b) May not be paid for speech-language pathology or audiology services provided by the person,
except that the person may be provided a reasonable educational stipend.

27 [(4) Without obtaining a license under this chapter, a teacher licensed by the Teacher Standards

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1 and Practices Commission and holding a communications disorders or speech impaired endorsement

2 issued by the commission may practice speech-language pathology if the person:]

3 [(a) Practices speech-language pathology solely in the course and scope of the person's duties as 4 an employee of an education service district, a school district or a charter school; and]

5 [(b) Complies with ORS 681.360 to 681.375 and rules adopted under ORS 681.360 to 681.375 when 6 supervising speech-language pathology assistants.]

[(5)] (4) Without obtaining a license under this chapter, a person may:

8 (a) Consult with or disseminate the person's research findings and scientific information to an
 9 accredited academic [institutions] institution or a governmental [agencies] agency; and

10 (b) Offer lectures to the public for a fee, monetary or otherwise.

11 <u>SECTION 2.</u> The amendments to ORS 681.230 by section 1 of this 2015 Act become oper-12 ative on July 1, 2016.

13 <u>SECTION 3.</u> Notwithstanding the amendments to ORS 681.230 by section 1 of this 2015 14 Act, a teacher who is licensed by the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission and who 15 holds a communications disorders or speech impaired endorsement issued by the commission 16 may continue to practice speech-language pathology on and after July 1, 2016, without ob-17 taining a license under ORS chapter 681 if the person:

18 (1) Was licensed and endorsed by the commission before July 1, 2016;

(2) Practices speech-language pathology solely in the course and scope of the person's
 duties as an employee of an education service district, a school district or a charter school;
 and

(3) Complies with ORS 681.360 to 681.375 and rules adopted under ORS 681.360 to 681.375
 when supervising speech-language pathology assistants.

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
