SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Requires medical marijuana facilities and marijuana retailers to post at facility or on premises of retail location notice of **potential** harmful effects of marijuana on pregnant women, **fetuses and breastfeeding infants** [and potential for marijuana to cause birth defects].

Becomes operative January 1, 2016.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to disclosure of information to consumers of marijuana; and declaring an emergency.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) A medical marijuana facility registered under ORS 475.314, and a 5 marijuana retailer licensed under section 22, chapter 1, Oregon Laws 2015, must post at the 6 facility or on the premises of the retail location notice of:

7 (a) The potential harmful effects of marijuana on pregnant women;

8 (b) The potential harmful effects of marijuana on fetuses; and

9 (c) The potential harmful effects of marijuana on breastfeeding infants.

10 (2) Notice required by this section must be posted in a location that is clearly visible to 11 any individual receiving:

(a) From the registered medical marijuana facility, usable marijuana as defined in ORS
 475.302; or

(b) From the marijuana retailer, marijuana as defined in section 5, chapter 1, Oregon
 Laws 2015.

(3)(a) The Oregon Health Authority shall adopt by rule the contents of the notice re quired by this section for medical marijuana facilities registered under ORS 475.314.

(b) The Oregon Liquor Control Commission shall adopt by rule the contents of the notice
 required by this section for marijuana retailers licensed under section 22, chapter 1, Oregon
 Laws 2015.

(c) Before adopting rules under this subsection, the authority and the commission shall
 consult with one another.

23 SECTION 2. (1) Section 1 of this 2015 Act becomes operative on January 1, 2016.

(2) The Oregon Health Authority and the Oregon Liquor Control Commission may take
 any action before the operative date specified in subsection (1) of this section that is necessary to enable the authority or the commission to exercise, on and after the operative date

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- 1 specified in subsection (1) of this section, all the duties, functions and powers conferred on
- 2 the authority and the commission by section 1 of this 2015 Act.
- 3 <u>SECTION 3.</u> This 2015 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
- 4 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2015 Act takes effect
 5 on its passage.

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
