5 "<u>SECTION 1.</u> In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appro-6 priated to the Emergency Board, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, out of the General 7 Fund, the amount of \$30,000,000 for the purposes for which the Emergency Board lawfully 8 may allocate funds.

9 "<u>SECTION 2.</u> (1) In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropriated to the Emergency Board, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, out of the In General Fund, the amount of \$120,000,000, to be allocated to state agencies for state employee compensation changes for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015.

<u>SECTION 5.</u> Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation
