Senate Bill 564

Sponsored by Senators MONNES ANDERSON, KRUSE

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Specifies that personally identifiable information may not be reported to Oregon Health Authority for purposes related to collecting data related to cancer and benign tumors of brain and central nervous system. Requires authority, on or before January 1, 2016, to remove all personally identifiable information from registry system.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to the registry system for the collection of information related to cancer; creating new 3 provisions; amending ORS 432.510; and declaring an emergency.

4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

5 **SECTION 1.** ORS 432.510 is amended to read:

6 432.510. (1) The Oregon Health Authority shall establish a uniform, statewide, population-based 7 registry system for the collection of information [determining] used to determine the incidence of 8 cancer and benign tumors of the brain and central nervous system and related data. The purpose 9 of the registry shall be to provide information to design, target, monitor, facilitate and evaluate ef-10 forts to determine the causes or sources of cancer and benign tumors among the residents of 11 [Oregon] this state and to reduce the burden of cancer and benign tumors [in Oregon] on the res-12 idents of this state. Such efforts may include [but are not limited to]:

(a) Targeting populations in need of cancer screening services or evaluating screening or other
cancer control services;

(b) Supporting the operation of hospital registries in monitoring and upgrading the care and theend results of treatment for cancer and benign tumors;

17 (c) Investigating suspected clusters or excesses of cancer and benign tumors both in occupa-18 tional settings and in the [state's] environment generally;

(d) Conducting studies to identify cancer hazards to the public health and cancer hazard reme-dies; and

(e) Projecting the benefits or costs of alternative policies regarding the prevention or treatmentof cancer and benign tumors.

(2)(a) Subject to paragraphs (b) and (c) of this subsection, the authority shall adopt rules necessary to carry out [the purposes of] ORS 432.510 to 432.550 and 432.900, including [but not limited to] designating which types of cancer and benign tumors of the brain and central nervous system are reportable to the [statewide] registry established under this section, the data to be reported[,] and the data reporting standards and format. [and the effective date after which reporting by health care facilities, clinical laboratories and practitioners shall be required.]

(b) Personally identifiable information may not be reported to the authority under this
section.

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(c) Except as provided in paragraph (b) of this subsection, when adopting rules under this 1 2 subsection, the authority shall, to the greatest extent practicable, conform the rules to the standards and procedures established by the American College of Surgeons Commission on Cancer, with the 3 goal of achieving uniformity in the collection and reporting of data. 4

(3) The authority shall: 5

(a) Conduct a program of epidemiologic analyses of registry data collected under [subsection (1) 6

of] this section to assess control, prevention, treatment and causation of cancer and benign tumors 7 in [Oregon] this state; and 8

9 (b) Utilize the data to promote, facilitate and evaluate programs designed to reduce the burden of cancer and benign tumors [among] on the residents of [Oregon] this state. 10

(4) The authority shall: 11

12(a) Collaborate in studies of cancer and benign tumors with clinicians and epidemiologists and publish reports on the results of such studies; and 13

(b) Cooperate with the National Institutes of Health and the Centers for Disease Control and 14

15 Prevention in providing [incidence data for] data on the incidence of cancer and benign tumors of the brain and central nervous system. 16

(5) The authority shall establish a training program for the personnel of participating health 17 care facilities and a quality control program for data [for cancer and benign tumors] reported to the 18 [state registry] authority under this section. 19

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SECTION 2. (1) The amendments to ORS 432.510 by section 1 of this 2015 Act apply to data reported to the Oregon Health Authority on or after January 1, 2016.

22(2) The authority shall adopt rules as required by the amendments to ORS 432.510 by section 1 of this 2015 Act no later than January 1, 2016. 23

(3) On or before January 1, 2016, the authority shall remove from the registry established 24 under ORS 432.510 all personally identifiable information that is a part of the registry. 25

SECTION 3. This 2015 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 2627peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2015 Act takes effect on its passage. 28

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
