Senate Bill 612

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Requires school districts to screen students for risk factors for dyslexia and to ensure specified staff members receive training related to dyslexia.

Directs Department of Education to designate dyslexia specialist.

Requires teacher education institutions and teacher education programs to provide course on dyslexia.

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A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to dyslexia.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) Each school district shall ensure that:

5 (a) Every student who is first enrolled at a school or a public charter school in the school

6 district for kindergarten or first grade receives a screening of risk factors for dyslexia, in-7 cluding:

8 (A) Phonological awareness;

9 (B) Rapid naming skills;

10 (C) The correspondence between sounds and letters; and

11 (D) Family history of difficulty in learning to read.

(b) Every licensed or registered teacher of kindergarten through grade three, special education teacher and reading specialist receives annual training on early identification of students with dyslexia, early intervention for students with dyslexia and evidence-based instructional practices for students with dyslexia.

(c) Every licensed or registered teacher of grades 4 through 12 receives annual training
on how best to support and offer accommodations to students with dyslexia.

(2) The Department of Education shall designate a dyslexia specialist to provide school
districts with resources and support necessary to assist students with dyslexia and their
families.

(3) The Teacher Standards and Practices Commission may not approve a teacher educa tion institution or teacher education program under ORS 342.147 unless the institution or
program provides a minimum of one course on dyslexia that complies with the knowledge
and practice standards of an international organization on dyslexia.

25 <u>SECTION 2.</u> The requirements of section 1 (1) of this 2015 Act first apply to the 2016-2017 26 school year.

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
