² <u>"SECTION 1.</u> (1) In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is ap-³ propriated to the Oregon Health Authority, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, out of ⁴ the General Fund, the amount of \$200,000, which may be expended for the purpose of pro-⁵ viding assistance for the purchase of fresh, unprocessed, locally grown fruits, vegetables and ⁶ herbs from farmers' markets or roadside stands under the Senior Farm Direct Nutrition ⁷ Program.

8 "(2) In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropriated to the 9 Oregon Health Authority, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, out of the General Fund, 10 the amount of \$100,000, which may be expended for the purpose of providing assistance for 11 the purchase of fresh, unprocessed, locally grown fruits, vegetables and herbs from farmers' 12 markets or roadside stands under the Women, Infants and Children Farm Direct Nutrition 13 Program.

14 "<u>SECTION 2.</u> (1) In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropriated to the Emergency Board, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, out of the 16 General Fund, the amount of \$200,000, to be allocated to Oregon Health Authority for:

17 "(a) Matching funds for a grant from the United States Department of Agriculture 18 through the federal WIC Farmers' Market Nutrition Program or the federal Senior Farmers' 19 Market Nutrition Program or from any other federal or state agency, where the grant re-20 lates to the provision of fresh, unprocessed, locally grown fruits, vegetables and herbs;

21 "(b) Expansion of the Farm Direct Nutrition Program and the Senior Farm Direct Nu-22 trition Program described in ORS 411.813; or

23 "(c) Any other means of providing assistance for the purchase of fresh, unprocessed, lo-24 cally grown fruits, vegetables and herbs.

"(2) If any of the moneys appropriated by subsection (1) of this section are not allocated
by the Emergency Board prior to December 1, 2016, the moneys remaining on that date become available for any purpose for which the Emergency Board lawfully may allocate funds.
"<u>SECTION 3.</u> This 2015 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2015 Act takes effect
July 1, 2015.".

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
