4	" <u>SECTION 1.</u> Section 2 of this 2015 Act is added to and made a part of ORS 410.595 to
5	410.625.
6	"SECTION 2. (1) The Home Care Commission shall adopt a statewide plan to:
7	"(a) Increase participation in the home care registry maintained by the commission un-
8	der ORS 410.604;
9	"(b) Increase the number of home care workers in this state in order to meet the need
10	that will arise with the implementation of the Fair Labor Standards Act; and
11	"(c) Continue the commission's work to create a career ladder for home care workers
12	so that they may become greater skilled and exceptional home care workers.
13	"(2) The plan must include an outreach and marketing strategy and skills development
14	provisions for home care workers who provide home care services to individuals requiring a
15	higher level of support.
16	"(3) The commission shall contract with a public or private entity with appropriate ex-
17	pertise to recommend the design for the statewide plan described in this section.
18	"SECTION 3. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appro-
19	priated to the Department of Human Services, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, out
20	of the General Fund, the amount of \$1,500,000, which shall be made available to the Home
21	Care Commission for expenses in carrying out section 2 of this 2015 Act.
22	"SECTION 4. (1) The Legislative Assembly encourages the Department of Human Ser-
23	vices to:
24	"(a) Implement a single online application for all home care workers, as defined in ORS
25	410.600, to apply to be included on the registry maintained by the Home Care Commission

28	care services in this state, regardless of whether the recipient of the services:
29	"(A) Has a physical disability, a mental illness or a developmental disability; or

31	"(2) The department shall report to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly
32	related to human services, as appropriate, no later than December 1 of each year beginning
33	in 2015, on the status of implementing an online application for, and assigning a unique pro-
34	vider number to, home care workers.

17 "<u>SECTION 7.</u> ORS 410.604, as amended by section 6, chapter 116, Oregon Laws 2014, is 18 amended to read:

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"410.604. (1) The Home Care Commission shall ensure the quality of home care services by:

"(a) Establishing qualifications for home care workers, with the advice and consent of the Department of Human Services, to ensure the effective delivery of home care services by a qualified,
committed, experienced and well-trained home care workforce;

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"(b) Conducting orientation sessions for home care workers;

"[(b)] (c) Establishing training requirements for home care workers, including personal support workers, as the commission deems appropriate, and providing training opportunities for home care workers and elderly persons and persons with disabilities who employ home care workers or personal support workers;

"[(c)] (d) Establishing the home care registry and maintaining the registry with qualified home
 care workers;

"[(d)] (e) Providing routine, emergency and respite referrals of home care workers;
