## A-Engrossed Senate Bill 865

Ordered by the Senate April 23 Including Senate Amendments dated April 23

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Authorizes county to exempt first \$250,000 of assessed value of homestead of surviving spouse of fire service professional or police officer killed in line of duty from property taxes [*imposed by county*]. Requires application to county assessor on form prescribed by Department of Revenue.

Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT 1 2 Relating to county property taxes; and prescribing an effective date. 3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: 4 SECTION 1. (1) As used in this section: (a) "Fire service professional" and "police officer" have the meanings given those terms 5 6 in ORS 181.610. (b) "Homestead" means real or personal property that is an owner-occupied primary 7 8 residence. 9 (c) "Surviving spouse" means the spouse of a fire service professional or police officer 10 killed in the line of duty. 11 (2) A county may provide, by ordinance or resolution, that the first \$250,000 of assessed 12 value of the homesteads of surviving spouses located in the county shall be exempt from all 13 taxes, fees, charges and assessments imposed on the homesteads. (3)(a) A surviving spouse seeking the exemption granted under this section must file an 14 15application with the county assessor on or before April 1 preceding the first property tax 16 year for which the exemption is sought. 17 (b) The application must: 18 (A) Be made on a form prescribed by the Department of Revenue; 19 (B) Designate the property for which the exemption is claimed; (C) Include a statement setting forth the basis for eligibility for the exemption; and 20 (D) Include a written statement signed by the surviving spouse affirming that all infor-2122mation contained in the application is true. 23(c) A timely application shall be approved if all requirements for the exemption are met. SECTION 2. This 2015 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the date on which the 2015 24 25regular session of the Seventy-eighth Legislative Assembly adjourns sine die.

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
