CHAPTER

AN ACT

Relating to the offense of unlawful moped or motorcycle operation; creating new provisions; and amending ORS 814.200.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. ORS 814.200 is amended to read:

814.200. (1) A person operating a moped or motorcycle commits the offense of unlawful moped or motorcycle operation if the person [does any of the following]:

[(a) Fails to sit on a permanent and regular seat attached to the moped or motorcycle.]

[(b)] (a) Fails to sit astride, or to stand astride, the moped or motorcycle seat while facing forward [and with one leg on each side of the moped or motorcycle.]; or

[(c)] (b) Carries a package, bundle or other article [which] that prevents the person from keeping both hands on the handlebars.

(2) The offense described in this section, unlawful moped or motorcycle operation, is a Class B traffic violation.

SECTION 2. The amendments to ORS 814.200 by section 1 of this 2015 Act apply to offenses committed on or after the effective date of this 2015 Act.
