## **Senate Joint Memorial 11**

Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON VETERANS AND EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Urges Congress to improve and support efforts to bring health care to veterans in rural communities.

<b>2</b>	To the President of the United States and the Senate and the House of Representatives of the United
3	States of America, in Congress assembled:
4	We, your memorialists, the Seventy-eighth Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon, in leg-
5	islative session assembled, respectfully represent as follows:
6	Whereas there are approximately 22 million veterans living today, 5.3 million of whom live in
7	rural areas; and
8	Whereas 3.2 million veterans who live in rural areas are enrolled in the Veterans Health Ad-
9	ministration (VHA) health care system; and
10	Whereas 2.6 million patients enrolled in the VHA health care system have a service-connected
11	disability; and
12	Whereas 960,000 veterans from rural areas have a service-connected disability; and
13	Whereas a disproportionate share of all service members are from rural areas; and
14	Whereas many veterans from rural areas return to their rural communities after their service
15	period; and
16	Whereas since its inception in 2007, the Veterans Health Administration Office of Rural Health
17	has supported nearly 2,000 projects and programs to make health care more accessible for veterans
18	in rural areas; and
19	Whereas despite this progress, the Office of Rural Health has made incremental and inconsistent
20	progress in building an accessible health care infrastructure to deliver services to veterans in rural
21	areas; and
22	Whereas health care for veterans in rural areas remains more costly and more difficult to access
23	than health care for veterans in urban areas; and
24	Whereas efforts should be made to improve the quality of care at and efficiency of health care
25	facilities serving veterans in rural areas; now, therefore,
26	Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:
27	That we, the members of the Seventy-eighth Legislative Assembly, urge the Congress of the
28	United States to support the mission of the Veterans Health Administration Office of Rural Health
29	and efforts to improve access to health care for veterans in rural areas; and be it further
30	Resolved, That we urge Congress to improve and support outreach efforts and accelerate the
31	pace of efforts to bring health care to veterans in rural communities; and be it further
