PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 28

- On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, after "253.690," insert "254.431,".
- On page 4, after line 39, insert:
- "SECTION 5. ORS 254.431, as amended by section 3, chapter 67, Oregon
- 4 Laws 2014, and section 3, chapter 112, Oregon Laws 2014, is amended to read:
- 5 "254.431. (1) If a ballot is challenged because it is returned in an unsigned
- 6 return identification envelope or because the signature of an elector on a
- 7 return identification envelope does not match the signature in the voter
- 8 registration record for the elector, the county clerk shall mail to the elector
- 9 a notice that describes the nature of the challenge. The Secretary of State
- shall design a standard form to be used in all notifications sent by county
- 11 clerks under this subsection.
- "(2)(a) In order for the vote of the elector to be counted, the elector must
- provide evidence sufficient to disprove the challenge not later than the 14th
- 14 calendar day after the date of the election.
- 15 "(b) If the elector does not provide evidence sufficient to disprove a
- 16 challenge alleging that the signature of the elector on a return identification
- 17 envelope does not match the signature in the voter registration record for
- the elector by the 14th calendar day after the date of the election, the reg-
- 19 istration of the elector shall be considered inactive.
- "(3)(a) The [county clerk] filing officer may not release as a public record
- 21 any information that could be used to identify an elector whose ballot has
- been challenged under this section until the eighth calendar day after the

- 1 date of an election.
- 2 "(b) Following the seventh calendar day after the date of an election, the
- 3 [county clerk] filing officer may disclose as a public record under ORS
- 4 192.410 to 192.505 the following information about each elector whose ballot
- 5 was challenged under this section:
- 6 "(A) The name of the elector;
- 7 "(B) The residence addresses of the elector; and
- 8 "(C) The reason the elector's ballot is being challenged.
- 9 "(4) As used in this section, 'filing officer' means:
- 10 "(a) The Secretary of State, for federal or statewide elections and
- 11 for elections to the office of state Senator or Representative; or
- "(b) The county clerk, for county, city or district elections.".
