## PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 2543

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, delete line 17 and insert:

2 "(6)(a) 'Gift card' means a prefunded record that is stored and redeemed 3 using an electronic card evidencing a promise that the issuer will provide 4 goods or services to the owner of the record in the amount shown in the 5 record.

6 "(b) 'Gift card' does not include prepaid telephone calling cards, prepaid 7 commercial mobile radio services as defined in 47 C.F.R. 20.3 or any gift card 8 usable with more than one seller of goods or services.".

9 On page 2, delete lines 24 through 33 and insert:

10 "<u>SECTION 3.</u> (1) An issuer of a gift card shall ascertain whether the 11 owner or purchaser of each gift card sold is a resident of this state and 12 shall maintain a record of each gift card sold to a resident of this 13 state.

"(2) The value of the gift card is presumed abandoned if the value
 of the gift card has not been redeemed within three years after the
 later of:

17 "(a) The date of purchase of the gift card; or

"(b) The date of the last transaction by the owner of the gift card
 that increased or decreased the value of the gift card.

"(3) If the address of the owner or purchaser of the gift card presumed abandoned is within this state, 80 percent of the gift card's
value is subject to the custody of this state as unclaimed property.

1 "(4) If the records of the issuer of a gift card do not show that the 2 owner or purchaser of the gift card is a resident of this state, the gift 3 card presumed abandoned shall be subject to the custody of the 4 issuer's state of incorporation, until another state comes forward with 5 proof of a superior right to escheat.

6 "(5) A gift card issuer that accepts a gift card presumed abandoned 7 under this section in exchange for goods or services may request re-8 imbursement from the Department of State Lands under ORS 98.392 9 and 98.396 in the amount tendered by the gift card presumed aban-10 doned. The department shall reimburse the gift card issuer up to the 11 amount of the gift card balance at the time of the transaction.

"(6) Notwithstanding ORS 98.302 (7), for purposes of ORS 98.302 to
98.436, the holder of a gift card is the issuer of the gift card.".
