PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 117

1 On <u>page 1</u> of the printed bill, delete lines 4 through 31.

3 "<u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) The Task Force on Jurisdictional Transfers is es-

4 tablished, consisting of 12 members appointed as follows:

"(a) The President of the Senate shall appoint two members from
among members of the Senate as follows:

7 "(A) One member from the Democratic party.

8 "(B) One member from the Republican party.

- 9 "(b) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint two
 10 members from among members of the House of Representatives as
 11 follows:
- 12 "(A) One member from the Democratic party.

13 "(B) One member from the Republican party.

"(c) The President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House shall

"(A) Two members who are employees of the Department of

- 20 "(D) One member representing an urban city.

- 22 "(c) The Governor shall appoint two members as follows:

1 "(A) One member of the general public.

2 "(B) One member representing the Governor.

"(2)(a) The task force shall evaluate and make recommendations concerning the transfer of highways from the jurisdiction of the state to the jurisdiction of a city or county or from the jurisdiction of a city or county to the jurisdiction of the state. The task force shall consider:

8 "(A) The potential cost and liability associated with jurisdictional
9 transfers;

"(B) The potential benefit to cities, counties and the state of juris dictional transfers;

"(C) Alternatives to managing state highways that run through
 communities without transferring the state highways to cities or
 counties; and

"(D) Alternatives to managing city highways and county highways
 without transferring the highways to the state.

"(b) As used in this subsection, 'highway' has the meaning given
that term in ORS 801.305.

"(3) A majority of the voting members of the task force constitutes
 a quorum for the transaction of business.

"(4) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a
 majority of the voting members of the task force.

"(5) The task force shall elect two of its members to serve as cochairs.

25 **"(6) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority** 26 **shall make an appointment to become immediately effective.**

"(7) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the
 call of the co-chairs.

"(8) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of
 the task force.

1 "(9) The task force shall:

"(a) Submit an initial report in the manner provided by ORS 192.245,
and may include recommendations for legislation, to an interim committee of the Legislative Assembly related to transportation no later
than December 1, 2015.

"(b) Submit a final report in the manner provided by ORS 192.245,
and may include recommendations for legislation, to an interim committee of the Legislative Assembly related to transportation no later
than September 15, 2016.

"(10) Members of the task force who are not members of the Leg islative Assembly are not entitled to compensation or reimbursement
 for expenses and serve as volunteers.

"(11) Members of the Legislative Assembly appointed to the task
 force are nonvoting members of the task force and may act in an ad visory capacity only.

16 "(12) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, 17 are directed to assist the task force in the performance of its duties 18 and, to the extent permitted by laws relating to confidentiality, to 19 furnish such information and advice as the members of the task force 20 consider necessary to perform their duties.".

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
