PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 2024

1 On <u>page 1</u> of the printed bill, line 2, delete "creating new provisions; 2 amending ORS 414.710;".

3 Delete lines 5 through 28 and delete <u>page 2</u> and insert:

4 "SECTION 1. (1) As used in this section:

5 "(a) 'Dental home' means a dental care team or clinic that provides

6 the following core services:

7 "(A) Comprehensive dental care;

8 "(B) Basic preventive dental services;

9 "(C) Referral to dental specialists; and

10 "(D) Family centered dental care.

- 11 **"(b) 'Health worker' includes:**
- 12 "(A) A community health worker;
- 13 "(B) A personal health navigator;
- 14 "(C) A peer wellness specialist;
- 15 "(D) A peer support specialist;

16 "(E) A community dental health coordinator; and

17 **"(F) A doula.**

"(2) The Oregon Health Authority, in consultation with coordinated
 care organizations and dental care organizations in this state, shall
 adopt rules and procedures for the training and certification of health
 workers to provide basic preventive dental services to underserved
 children.

"(3) The rules adopted under subsection (2) of this section must
 prescribe the training required for certification, including instruction
 on:

4 "(a) The performance of dental risk assessments;

5 "(b) The provision of basic preventive dental services; and

6 "(c) The referral of patients to dental care providers.

7 "(4) The authority shall adopt rules requiring that a certified health
8 worker:

9 "(a) Refer patients to dental homes as determined necessary by the
10 health worker; and

"(b) Recommend to patients, or to the parent or legal guardian of
 a patient, that the patient receive at least one dental risk assessment
 each year.

14 "(5) The authority shall reimburse the cost of basic preventive 15 dental services provided to medical assistance recipients by a certified 16 health worker, if the services are within the scope of the health 17 worker's certification under this section.

"SECTION 2. (1) Section 1 of this 2015 Act becomes operative on
 July 1, 2016.

"(2) The Oregon Health Authority may take any action before the operative date specified in subsection (1) of this section that is necessary to enable the authority to exercise, on or after the operative date specified in subsection (1) of this section, all of the duties, functions and powers conferred on the authority by section 1 of this 2015 Act.

25 "<u>SECTION 3.</u> Section 1 of this 2015 Act applies to services provided
 26 on or after the operative date specified in section 2 of this 2015 Act.

"<u>SECTION 4.</u> This 2015 Act being necessary for the immediate
preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is
declared to exist, and this 2015 Act takes effect on its passage.".

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
