## PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 2941

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, after the semicolon insert "creating 2 new provisions; amending ORS 757.603;".

3 Delete lines 4 through 27 and delete pages 2 through 5 and insert:

4 **"SECTION 1.** ORS 757.603 is amended to read:

"757.603. (1)(a) Except as provided in this subsection, [on and after March *1, 2002,*] an electric company shall provide all retail electricity consumers
that are connected to the electric company's distribution system with a regulated, cost-of-service rate option.

"(b) The Public Utility Commission by order may waive the requirement 9 of paragraph (a) of this subsection for any retail electricity consumer other 10 than residential electricity consumers and small commercial electricity con-11 sumers. [A waiver under this paragraph may not take effect before July 1, 122003.] Before ordering a waiver under this paragraph, the commission shall 13 conduct such studies as the commission deems necessary and provide notice 14 and opportunity for public comment and hearings. The commission may order 15 a waiver under this paragraph if the commission finds, based on an 16 evidentiary record developed through public comment and hearings, that a 17 market exists in which retail electricity consumers subject to the waiver are 18 able to: 19

20 "(A) Purchase supplies of electricity adequate to meet the needs of the 21 retail electricity consumers;

(B) Obtain multiple offers for electricity supplies within a reasonable

period of time; 1

"(C) Obtain reliable supplies of electricity; and 2

"(D) Purchase electricity at prices that are not unduly volatile and that 3 are just and reasonable. 4

"(2) [Not later than March 1, 2002,] Each electric company shall provide 5 each residential electricity consumer that is connected to its distribution 6 system a portfolio of rate options. The portfolio shall include at least the 7 8 following options:

"(a) A rate that reflects significant new renewable energy resources; 9 [and] 10

"(b) A market-based rate[.]; and 11

"(c) If the commission finds, through public comment and hearing 12or through market research conducted by the electric company, that 13 demand is sufficient to justify the rate, a rate option for electricity 14 associated with a specific renewable energy resource, including solar 15 photovoltaic energy. 16

"(3)(a) The commission shall regulate the cost-of-service rate option under 17 subsection (1) of this section and the portfolio of rate options under sub-18 section (2) of this section. The commission shall reasonably ensure that the 19 costs and risks of serving each option are reflected in the rates for each 20 option. 21

"(b) The commission may prohibit or otherwise limit the use of a cost-of- $\mathbf{22}$ service rate by retail electricity consumers who have been served through 23 direct access, and may limit switching among portfolio options and the 24 cost-of-service rate by residential electricity consumers. 25

"SECTION 2. (1) The Public Utility Commission shall evaluate pro-26 grams identified by the commission that incentivize the development  $\mathbf{27}$ and use of solar photovoltaic energy systems and shall submit a report 28 to the Legislative Assembly, that: 29

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"(a) Recommends the most effective, efficient and equitable ap-

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proach to incentivizing the development and use of solar photovoltaic
 energy systems in this state; and

"(b) For each program, makes a recommendation on whether the
program should be discontinued, modified or extended or should remain unchanged.

6 "(2) In developing recommendations under subsection (1) of this 7 section, the commission shall consider:

8 "(a) The resource value of solar energy;

"(b) How to minimize confusion and transaction costs for persons
who participate in programs that incentivize the development and use
of solar photovoltaic energy systems;

"(c) The costs borne by persons who do not participate in programs
that incentivize the development and use of solar photovoltaic energy
systems;

15 "(d) The commission's study of the effectiveness of programs that 16 incentivize the development and use of solar photovoltaic energy sys-17 tems prepared pursuant to section 4, chapter 244, Oregon Laws 2013; 18 and

"(3) The commission shall consult with the State Department of
 Energy in conducting the study and making the report required by
 subsection (1) of this section.

"(4) The commission shall submit the report required by subsection
(1) of this section, including any recommendations for legislation, to
the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to energy
on or before September 15, 2016.

"SECTION 3. This 2015 Act being necessary for the immediate
preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is
declared to exist, and this 2015 Act takes effect on its passage.".

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
