PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 3143

1 On <u>page 1</u> of the printed bill, delete lines 4 through 27 and delete <u>page</u> 2 <u>2</u> and insert:

"<u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) As used in this section, 'tax-exempt' means recognized as tax-exempt under section 501(c) of the Internal Revenue
Code.

"(2) A tax-exempt nonprofit organization may supply to the Oregon 6 Liquor Control Commission copies of informational materials about 7 human trafficking. The organization may not charge the commission 8 for the materials. The form of the materials may include, but need 9 not be limited to, adhesive stickers. The materials may not include 10 information on topics other than human trafficking. The materials 11 must be limited in content to objectively verifiable information, except 12that the materials may include logos, symbols, graphics or similar 13 devices and may include a cover letter to commission licensees to urge 14 the licensees to post the adhesive materials or other materials at the 15licensees' premises. 16

"(3) Except as provided in this subsection, if a tax-exempt nonprofit organization supplies the commission with informational materials as described in subsection (2) of this section, the commission shall include a copy of the materials with each license renewal notice that the commission sends to an on-premises sales, off-premises sales or brewery-public house licensee. The number of copies of the materials that the commission sends to licensees may not exceed the number of copies that the organization supplies to the commission. If the commission determines that the informational materials have offensive or inappropriate content, the commission may refuse to include the materials with license renewal notices or otherwise assist in distributing the materials.

"<u>SECTION 2.</u> Section 1 of this 2015 Act applies to license renewal
notices that the Oregon Liquor Control Commission sends to licensees
on or after the effective date of this 2015 Act.

"SECTION 3. Section 1 of this 2015 Act is repealed on January 2,
2018.

"<u>SECTION 4.</u> This 2015 Act being necessary for the immediate
 preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is
 declared to exist, and this 2015 Act takes effect on its passage.".

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
