## PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 3526

1 On <u>page 1</u> of the printed bill, delete lines 4 through 27 and delete <u>page</u> 2 <u>2</u> and insert:

3 "SECTION 1. (1) As used in this section and sections 2 and 3 of this
4 2015 Act:

"(a) 'Area median income' means the median income for the metropolitan statistical area in which the proposed grant project is located, as determined by the Housing and Community Services
Department, adjusted for household size.

9 "(b) 'Oregon Main Street Network' means the entity administered
10 by the State Historic Preservation Officer designated under ORS
11 358.565 to provide assistance, training and technical services to com12 munities in Oregon desiring to strengthen, preserve and revitalize
13 their historic downtown commercial districts.

"(c) 'Rural area' means an area located entirely outside the ac knowledged Portland Metropolitan Area Regional Urban Growth
 Boundary and the acknowledged urban growth boundaries of cities
 with populations of 30,000 or more.

18 "(2) There is established in the State Parks and Recreation Depart-19 ment the Oregon Main Street Revitalization Grant Program for the 20 purpose of providing grants on an annual, competitive basis from the 21 Oregon Main Street Revitalization Grant Program Fund established 22 under section 2 of this 2015 Act to be used for the following purposes: "(a) To acquire, rehabilitate and construct buildings on properties
in designated downtown areas statewide; and

"(b) To facilitate community revitalization that will lead to private
investment, job creation or retention, establishing or expanding viable
businesses or creating a stronger tax base.

6 "(3)(a) For the purpose of making grants under the program, the 7 department shall adopt a formula that:

8 "(A) Provides for grant funds to be made available statewide while 9 concentrating funds and resources in those areas of the state with the 10 greatest need for main street revitalization and economic develop-11 ment; and

"(B) Provides that a minimum of 50 percent of available grant funds
 will be reserved for projects in rural areas.

14 "(b) In awarding grants under the program, the department shall 15 give priority to grant proposals for projects that are located in tradi-16 tionally underserved communities, including rural areas and commu-17 nities that demonstrate significant financial barriers to efforts to 18 redevelop or rehabilitate downtown areas.

"(4) The department shall develop criteria to determine the eligibility of grant applicants and proposed projects. The criteria must require that applicants be organizations that participate in the Oregon Main Street Network and demonstrate the past or prospective capacity to work with project leaders in designated local communities or downtown areas.

"(5) Project proposals submitted by grant applicants may include
evidence of demonstrated need for main street revitalization and economic development by providing information about the economic
character of the project, including but not limited to:

"(a) The proportion of households at or below the federal poverty
 rate in the targeted project location and the surrounding community;

"(b) The area median income in the proposed project location and
 surrounding community;

"(c) The percentage of renters in the proposed project location and
surrounding community; and

5 "(d) The percentage of persons in the proposed project location and 6 surrounding community with weekly wages that are less than or equal 7 to the most recent federal poverty guidelines for a family of three that 8 are applicable to Oregon residents and that are published annually in 9 the Federal Register by the United States Department of Health and 10 Human Services.

11 "(6) The State Parks and Recreation Department shall:

"(a) Provide technical assistance and project overview and moni toring for successful grant recipients; and

"(b) Provide regular updates to other state agencies, including but
 not limited to the Oregon Business Development Department and the
 Department of Transportation, that have an interest in the imple mentation and administration of the program.

"(7) Each grant awarded under this section shall require, as a con dition of receiving funding, matching funds in an amount to be de termined by the State Parks and Recreation Department.

"(8) All amounts awarded as grants must be used by recipients, for the approved purposes set forth in successful grant applications, within three years of receipt of the funds. Any funds not expended within that time period must be returned to the department for deposit in the Oregon Main Street Revitalization Grant Program Fund.

"(9) The department shall adopt rules to implement the program and the provisions of this section. The department may consult with the Oregon Business Development Department and the Department of Transportation in adopting the rules.

30 "SECTION 2. (1) The Oregon Main Street Revitalization Grant Pro-

gram Fund is established in the State Treasury, separate and distinct
 from the General Fund. Interest earned by the Oregon Main Street
 Revitalization Grant Program Fund shall be credited to the fund.

4 "(2) Moneys in the fund consist of:

5 "(a) Amounts donated to the fund;

6 "(b) Amounts appropriated or otherwise transferred to the fund by
7 the Legislative Assembly;

8 "(c) Amounts deposited in the fund under section 3 of this 2015 Act;

9 "(d) Investment earnings received on moneys in the fund;

"(e) Unused grant moneys returned pursuant to section 1 (8) of this
 2015 Act; and

12 "(f) Other amounts deposited in the fund from any source.

"(3) Moneys in the fund are continuously appropriated to the State
 Parks and Recreation Department for purposes of section 1 of this 2015
 Act and to pay the administrative costs associated with the fund.

16 "SECTION 3. (1) For the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, at the 17 request of the State Parks and Recreation Department, the State 18 Treasurer may issue lottery bonds pursuant to ORS 286A.560 to 19 286A.585 in an amount that does not exceed \$5 million in net proceeds 20 for the purposes described in subsection (2) of this section, plus an 21 additional amount estimated by the State Treasurer to be necessary 22 to pay bond-related costs.

"(2) Net proceeds of lottery bonds issued under this section in an amount sufficient to provide \$5 million in net proceeds and interest earnings must be transferred to the department for deposit into the Oregon Main Street Revitalization Grant Program Fund to provide grants pursuant to section 1 of this 2015 Act.

(3) The Legislative Assembly finds that the use of proceeds of lottery bonds issued pursuant to this section will create jobs, further economic development and enhance the economic vitality of Oregon downtowns and local communities by supporting projects that revitalize historic downtown commercial districts, redevelop and reuse existing buildings, facilitate small business relocation and expansion
initiatives and provide assistance, training and technical services.

<u>SECTION 4.</u> This 2015 Act being necessary for the immediate
preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is
declared to exist, and this 2015 Act takes effect on July 1, 2015.".

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
