Your recent visit to the Oregon DMV has started an automatic voter registration process for you. Please read the material below. If we do not hear from you by [insert deadline], you will be registered to vote.

We hope you will take advantage of your opportunity to exercise this fundamental right of citizenship. Voting allows you to be heard on major issues and choose who will represent us at city hall, the county courthouse, the state legislature, Congress, and the White House.

To vote in an election you must be an Oregon resident, a U.S. citizen, and 18 years old. However, you can register when you are 17 years old. If you do not meet these requirements, or if you think you are already registered, please contact the Oregon Elections Division.

You have three options:

- Do nothing. You will be registered to vote as a nonaffiliated voter (not a member of a political party).
- Choose a political party by returning the enclosed card. Joining a political party will allow you to vote in its primary elections.
- Use the enclosed card to opt-out and decline to register to vote.

The residence address of a registered voter is a public record. If that is a personal safety concern for you, return the enclosed card by [insert deadline] to decline registration. To register to vote without making your address public, apply for Oregon's Address Confidentiality Program (ACP) at doj.state.or.us/acp or apply to your County Clerk for a Personal Safety Exemption.

Once registered, you will automatically receive a ballot and instructions in the mail about two weeks before an election. When you vote, your ballot is secret and your choices cannot be matched up with your name.

If you have a disability and need accommodations, please contact us. Accommodations can include large print ballots, alternate format ballots, and other individual assistance.
