#### Public Hearing and Work Session

HB 2526 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means  
Directs Department of Justice to establish firearm safety and suicide prevention education program, to create or approve educational materials and to provide educational materials to gun dealers.

HB 3266  
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/14/2017 AGENDA: Provides that no person may use mechanical restraint, chemical restraint, prone restraint, physical restraint or seclusion on student in public education program.

#### Work Session

HB 2545  
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/14/2017 AGENDA: Allows deception detection examination administrator to proctor deception detection examination.

HB 2593  
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/14/2017 AGENDA: Requires that sexually explicit material involving minor remain in control of law enforcement agency or court throughout criminal proceeding or juvenile delinquency proceeding, provided that material is made reasonably available to defendant.

HB 2613  
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/14/2017 AGENDA: Expands offense of driving while under influence of intoxicants to include any drug that adversely affects person's physical or mental faculties to noticeable or perceptible degree.

HB 2614  
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/14/2017 AGENDA: Allows for blood test to be taken to determine presence of controlled substances or inhalants for purpose of Motorist Implied Consent Law.

- HB 2629  
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/14/2017 AGENDA: Provides that if district attorney presents documentary evidence of medical service charges at restitution hearing, evidence creates rebuttable presumption that charges are reasonable.
- HB 2793  
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/14/2017 AGENDA: Decreases penalties for crime of cheating.
- HB 2794  
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/14/2017 AGENDA: Reduces penalties for crime of possession of gambling records in the second degree.
- HB 2812  
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/14/2017 AGENDA: Directs Department of Human Services and Oregon Youth Authority to conduct statewide study regarding juveniles no later than July 1, 2018.
- HB 3049  
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/14/2017 AGENDA: Provides that person may not operate unmanned aircraft system so that unmanned aircraft system hovers over privately owned premises of another for more than 60 seconds.
- HB 3078 \*\*  
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/14/2017 AGENDA: Modifies eligibility for Family Sentencing Alternative Pilot Program. \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
- HB 3242  
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/14/2017 AGENDA: Requires peace officer to electronically record interview with youth when investigating crime, or allegation that youth committed act that if committed by adult would constitute crime.
- HB 3380 \*\*  
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/14/2017 AGENDA: Modifies eligibility for Family Sentencing Alternative Pilot Program. \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
- HB 3438  
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/14/2017 AGENDA: Directs Oregon Criminal Justice Commission to study reentry services and support and report results to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to judiciary on or before September 15, 2018.
- HB 3446  
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/14/2017 AGENDA: Provides that court has authority to enter judgment of conviction for Class A misdemeanor at any time after person has successfully completed sentence of probation if person was convicted of certain Class C felony traffic offenses and court makes certain findings.
