Public Hearing

- SB 934
Prohibits coordinated care organization from spending less than 14.4 percent of global budget on primary care and community health.
- SB 808
Provides that with respect to health screen testing for newborns, Oregon Health Authority shall specify that health testing service may conduct tests for conditions listed on most recent edition of Recommended Uniform Screening Panel by United States Department of Health and Human Services.
- SB 951
Requires insurers offering health benefit plans to provide coverage for abuse-deterrent opioid analgesic drug products.

Work Session

- SB 52
Requires ambulance services and emergency medical services providers to report patient encounter data to electronic emergency medical services data system managed by Oregon Health Authority.
- SB 419 **
Creates Hospital Rate Commission in Oregon Health Authority to review hospital charges billed by certain hospitals and recommend to Oregon Health Authority whether to approve charges as reasonable based on prescribed criteria. **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
- SB 964
Allows physician assistants to use hospital facilities for patient care.
- SB 786
Requires health care regulatory boards to allow health care practitioner to use telehealth when health care practitioner determines telehealth is appropriate.
- SB 485 **
Exempts, under specified conditions, for-profit or nonprofit business entity from requirement that licensed physicians hold majority of voting stock in professional corporation organized for purpose of practicing medicine or be majority of directors of professional corporation. **Subsequent Referral(s) to Business and Transportation
