







Major Budget Drivers and Environmental Factors

- Lead Abatement Federally Funded Responsibility
- Leverage Federal Funds with General/Other Funds Match
- Portland Air National Guard Base Storm Water Fees
- Deferred Maintenance of Armories \$134 million
- Office of Emergency Management Reduction of Federal grant awards from US Dept of Homeland Security
- Civil Engineering and Fire Support for the Fighter Alert Mission at Portland Airbase

Major changes in past 6 years

• 2009-11 Biennium:

- Federal Wartime Mobilizations peaked at 5,541 in 2009-10
- Completed 15 projects with \$4.8M federal ARRA funding
- \$72M Camp Withycombe Armed Forces Reserve Center completed

2011-13 biennium:

- Umatilla Chemical Depot Caretaker Contract (began July 2012)
- Great Recession: Lost 19 positions in Installations

• 2013-15 Biennium:

- Closure of Readiness Sustainment Maintenance Site (Nov 2014)
- \$25M Fort Dalles Readiness Center Completed

2015-17 Biennium:

- National Guard unit changes (April-September 2017)
- Organizational structure changes
- Text to 9-1-1 Began in August 2016, currently used by 8 PSAP's
- Indoor Firing Range Lead Contamination

Cost Containment, Program Delivery Improvements

- Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) certifications on four new Military Construction facilities
- Water consumption decreased by 16% since FFY 2015
- Energy Savings Projects Completed:
 - Camp Withycombe compressed air system upgrade: \$22,800 savings per year
 - Medford, Maison and Forest Grove Armories HVAC and insulation upgrades:
 \$41,850 savings per year.
 - Roseburg Armory Service Life Extension Project upgraded the energy systems resulting in a 70% reduction in energy use. Future solar panel project will bring this armory to net-zero in electricity usage (production = consumption).
- Energy Projects Underway or in Planning Stage:
 - Statewide Lighting Replacement Project: \$234,000 savings per year
 - Solar panel installation at 5 sites: \$57,455 savings per year
 - Biomass central heating plant at Umatilla: \$85,000 savings per year

- 6. Capital Construction Other Funds Limitation to purchase land for future readiness centers in Hillsboro and Redmond (POL 494)
- 7. General Fund Debt Service on new construction bonds for Armory Service Life Extension and Regional Armory Emergency Enhancement Projects (POL 480)

Long-Term Vacancies

OMD has 51 positions that have been vacant six months or longer:

- 4 are in process of being filled
- 4 are Seasonal Wildland Firefighters at Training Areas (off season) (100% FF)
- 13 at Umatilla restricted by Army funding (100% FF)
- 12 part-time Military Lease Agents (100% OF)
- 7 Security Guards at Portland and Kingsley Field Airbases (100% FF)
- 2 at Billeting Program at Kingsley Field-shifted to federal staff
- 1 Deputy Fire Chief at Portland Airbase (100% FF)
- 1 Program Analyst 2 at OEM (50% FF/ 50% GF)
- Remaining 7 have recruitment difficulties:
 - 1-Facility Energy Tech 3 at Portland Airbase (80% FF/ 20% GF)
 - 1-Facility Energy Tech 3 at Camp Rilea (100% FF)
 - 1-Plumber at Camp Rilea (100% FF)
 - 1-Custodial Services Coordinator in Installations (100% OF)
 - 1-Carpenter at Kingsley Field (85% FF/ 15% GF)
 - 1-Program Analyst 2 in Anti-Terrorism Program (100% FF)
 - 1-Admin Spec 2 (Range Operator) at Biak (100% FF)
