Measure Description:

Repeals greenhouse gas emissions goals and requires Environmental Quality Commission to adopt by rule statewide greenhouse gas emissions goal for 2025, and limits for years 2035 and 2050.

Government Unit(s) Affected:

Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT), Business Development Department (Business Oregon), Department of Energy, Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ), Public Utility Commission (PUC)

Analysis:

This fiscal impact statement is for the purpose of transmitting the measure from the House Committee on Energy and Environment to the House Committee on Rules. The bill repeals greenhouse gas emissions goals and requires the Environmental Quality Commission to adopt, by rule, statewide greenhouse gas emissions goals for 2025, and limits for years 2035 and 2050. The agencies anticipate having a fiscal impact associated with this bill, the amount of this impact is still being determined.
