RE:	Statistics on First Chamber Measures in Committee

House Human Services and Housing Committee Members,

Chair Keny-Guyer asked for statistics on the first chamber measures that were referred to the Committee on Human Services and Housing.

The Committee was referred a total of 105 house bills (6.99%) out of the 1,502 house bills introduced as of April 19, 2017. The graph below displays the statistics on the 105 bills and action the committee took on them.



Seventy bills (66.7%) were scheduled for a public hearing and 35 bills (33.3%) were not scheduled for a public hearing.

The Committee acted and voted on 62 bills (59.0%), of which 43 bills (40.9%) were subsequently referred to another committee and 19 bills (18.1%) were moved to the floor prior to the first chamber deadline on April 18, 2017.

The Committee is charged with examining bills regarding policy on human services and housing. Of the 62 bills acted on and voted on, 30 bills (48.4%) involved housing policy and 26 bills (41.9%) involved human services policy. Four bills established task forces and two bills were referred to the proper policy committee for consideration. The pie chart below displays the number and topic areas for the 62 bills acted on and voted on.



Currently, the Committee has a total of nine Senate bills to consider prior to the second chamber deadline on June 2, 2017. More Senate bills are likely to be referred to the committee in the coming weeks.
