 - One member representing the fire service (recommended by the Oregon Fire District Directors Association) (**D. JONES**)
 - One member representing the fire service (recommended by the Oregon Volunteer Fire Fighter's Association) (**OEDER**)
 - One member who is a member of the Oregon State Fire Fighter's Council (**CONNOLLY**)
 - One member representing corrections personnel (recommended by the Oregon State Sheriff's Association) (**J. MYERS**)
 - One member representing public safety telecommunications (**DUTRA**)
 - One member who is a district attorney (recommended by the Oregon District Attorneys' Association) (**VITOLINS**)
 - The Superintendent of State Police (**HAMPTON**)
 - The Chief of the Portland Police Bureau (**MARSHMAN**)
 - The State Fire Marshal (**WALKER**)
 - The Chief of the Portland Fire Bureau (**M. MYERS**)
 - The Director of the Department of Corrections (**PETERS**)
 - The Special Agent in Charge of the Federal Bureau of Investigations for the State of Oregon (**BRETZING**)
 - One member representing forest protection agencies (recommended by the State Forestry Department) (**vacant**)
 - One member who is an administrator of a municipality (recommended by the executive body of the League of Oregon Cities) (**DUNCAN**)
 - Two members who are non-management representatives of law enforcement (**ARAZIA, HERING**)
 - One member representing non-management Parole and Probation (**PURINGTON**)

- Two members representing the private security industry: one representing contract security service providers (GEIGER); one representative of propriety security service providers (BYRD)
- One member representing the public who shall have no interest or occupational responsibilities in the areas of responsibility given to the board (**PATRICK-JOLING**)
- One member representing the collective bargaining unit that represents the largest number of individual workers in the Department of Corrections (BURGER)
- Appointed members are limited to two terms

DUTIES AND AUTHORITY:

- Select chair and vice-chair
- Appoint subcommittees
- Meet at least every three months
- Establish minimum standards of physical, emotional, intellectual and moral fitness for police officers
- Establish professional development training for public safety personnel
- Establish a procedure for determining whether subject personnel meet required standards
- Certify subject public safety personnel as qualified; revoke certification
- Conduct inspections of training and standards
- The Board may:
 - Maintain and provide to appropriate agency information on applicants for employment
 - Conduct or assist local areas in conducting surveys and assist in the implementation of any recommendations resulting from the surveys
 - Encourage research by public and private agencies for the improvement of public safety services
 - Provide grants from funds appropriated and available to law enforcement and public safety agencies to conduct surveys or research
 - Provide training programs for person who operate detention facilities
 - Provide other training for public safety personnel and support staff
 - Enter into training agreements with federal, state or other governmental agencies
 - Grant multidiscipline certification to specified individuals
