 - No more than four members may belong to the same political party BALL (D); (HICKS (R); BEGLAU (N/A); BOVETT (D); TAPIA (D); HAZARABEDIAN (N/A); PARKER-ROSE (I))
 - Governor appoints the chair
 - Members serve a term of four years; may not serve more than two consecutive terms
- The chair may appoint committees to include persons who are not member of the commission with approval of Commission. Committee membership should provide adequate representation for all affected members of the criminal justice system

DUTIES AND AUTHORITY: ORS 137.654, 137.656

- Elect vice-chairperson
- Meet at least once per month
- Consult with and seek advice and counsel of the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court and the State Court Administrator on any matter that impacts the operation of the courts
- Improve the effectiveness and efficiency of state and local criminal justice systems by providing a centralized and impartial forum for statewide policy development and planning
- Develop and maintain a state criminal justice policy and comprehensive, long-range plan for a coordinated state criminal justice system that encompasses public safety, offender accountability, crime reduction and prevention and offender treatment and rehabilitation
- Conduct joint studies by agreement with other state agencies, boards or commissions on any matter within the jurisdiction of the commission
- Provide analytical and statistical criminal information to federal agencies
- Serve as a clearinghouse and information center for state and local sentencing practices
- May adopt amendments to the sentencing guidelines subject to legislative approval
