I have witnessed neighbors, friends, and clients experience no cause evictions and/or egregious rent increases which have made it impossible for them to remain in their homes, and for some, has even lead to homelessness. As a renter, I too have faced the hardship of paying ever growing rent each year which is exhausting more and more of my income, and compromising my ability to afford to live in Portland. I am in constant fear of rent increases pushing me and my fellow Portlanders out of my/our homes, and even out of the state.

This commonplace practice of no cause evictions and skyrocketing rents is effecting us all, but is especially impacting seniors, people with disabilities, and people of color who are vulnerable to discrimination and retaliation by landlords without any recourse or legal protections.
