Mr. Chair and Committee Members,

Thank you for hearing HB 3446. This measure creates a path relating to ORS 161.705 as it applies to certain felonies being reduced to a Class A Misdemeanor. The bill provides that a court has authority to enter a judgment of conviction for a Class A misdemeanor at any time after person has successfully completed sentence of probation if the person was convicted of a felony driving while suspended or revoked and court makes certain findings.

So...what is this all about you ask? Well...I'm glad you asked! © First, this bill is narrowly crafted (thanks for Clatsop County DA Josh Marquis). Second, this bill gives relief to those who received a felony conviction for driving under the Habitual Offender concept years ago, today.
