Indirect Jobs Created

Indirect jobs reflects how money spent by base organizations and individuals ripple through the local economy, increasing the income of local businesses, which in turn allow them to hire new employees and do more spending of their own at their suppliers and other businesses. We measure this additional economic impact by estimating the number of indirect jobs created as a result of local base spending, and multiplying that by the estimated average salary in the Klamath Falls area. The estimated average salary in the Klamath Falls area is obtained from the Bureau of Labor Statistics. Indirect job multiplier is based on the size of the employment base for each region surrounding an installation and the general mission of the base.

Kingsley Field is located four miles southeast of Klamath Falls in south central Oregon's high desert country. Midway between Portland and San Francisco, the location makes it an important link for west coast military bases.

From its beginning as Klamath Falls Naval Air Station in 1942, the base developed into what is currently a busy Oregon Air National Guard (ANG) training center for F-15 pilots.

In 1995, the Air National Guard assumed the airport tower control from the Federal Aviation Agency as part of the establishment of the 270th Air Traffic Control Squadron, a unit at Kingsley Field. The 270th ATCS joined the 173d Operations Group in October 2015.

In 2015, an active duty association was established. The 56th Operations Group/ Det 2 is a total force initiative to increase pilot production through the Air Education and Training Command.

The 173rd FW mission and vision remain constant:

Mission: "To train the best air-to-air combat pilots and serve the state and nation in times of peace and war."

Vision: "Citizen Soldiers building a worldclass training center to serve our community, the state of Oregon, and the nation."

Operations and Maintenance

Operation and Maintenance funding pays for the Flying Program, aviation fuel, Security, Environmental, Fire protection costs, transportation costs, military medical clinic costs, vehicle costs, travel costs, and other costs associated with operating and maintenaing the base's training and Air Traffic Control mission. Expenditures do not include payroll costs for those programs. Payroll is noted under Annual Payroll.

Military Construction costs are expenditures for construction, services, and procurement of materials, equipment and supplies that is off-base spending coordinated by on-base Civil Engineers. These expenditures reflect what Kingsley Air National Guard Base put into the economy by spending for purchased materials, supplies, equipment and contracts.

The Department of Defense Youth Program known as Starbase is a program that Kingsley Air National Guard Base participates in with the local community. The program exposes youth to a technological environment and positive role models found on military bases. The program provides 20-25 hours of instruction, using a common core curriculum that meets or exceeds the national standards.
