SUBJECT: Senate Bill 1062A, Healthy and Safe Schools Plans

Co-Chairs Monroe and Smith Warner, and members of the committee; my name is Gabriela Goldfarb, and I am the Environmental Public Health Section Manager of the Oregon Health Authority. I'm here to provide testimony on SB 1062A, which addresses a variety of environmental health topics in schools.

Students need a healthy environment in order to learn, grow and thrive. SB 1062A works toward creating such an environment by requiring school districts to develop and maintain a Healthy and Safe Schools Plan. This plan incorporates existing and new environmental health regulations into one document and identifies an individual responsible for implementing and maintaining the plan. It increases transparency for families and school staff about environmental hazards that may be present in schools by requiring the plan and any test results to be made available to the school community and the public.

SB 1062A is the result of successful collaboration among the legislative sponsors, the Department of Education, Oregon School Boards Association, local school districts and the Oregon Health Authority. This collaboration resulted in a bill that lays the foundation for practical and achievable improvements that benefit health and learning in Oregon schools.
