WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Directs county commission to appoint provider of victims' services to local public safety coordinating council.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

BACKGROUND:

ORS 423.560 to 423.569 requires counties to convene local public safety coordinating councils (LPSCC). Among other tasks, LPSCC are statutorily required to coordinate local criminal justice and juvenile justice policy, and to recommend to the county a plan for the use of related state resources. LPSCC are comprised of a wide array of city, county and state representatives; membership must include a police chief, sheriff, judge, district attorney, defense attorney, community corrections director, county commissioner, juvenile department director, health director, mental health director, a representative of the Oregon State Police, a representative of the Oregon Youth Authority, two representatives of cities and a member of the public.
